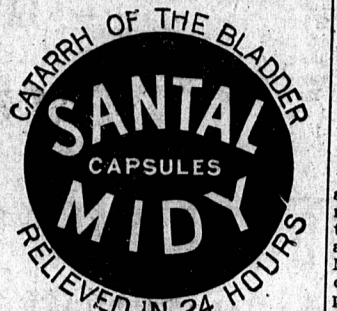

The Amherst News says: It is reported from Sackville that an I. C. R. auditor is now at work in the office of the N. B. and P. E. I. railway checking over the accounts, vouchers and general assets and liabilities of that railway. This work seems to foreshadow the early transfer of this railway line running from Sackville to Cape Tormentine to the Intercolonial Railway. It is reported that the transfer will be made on or about October 1st. It is to be hoped that other branch lines such as the Parrsboro line will also be taken over by the Government. 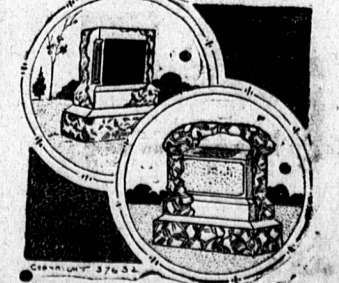
