OTTAWA, March 29.—The House today put the Tariff Bill, introduced by the Minister of Finance to change the duties on apples and petroleum and fuel oil, through Committee and give a second reading to a Bill providing for the salaries of the newly organized Court of Appeal in Saskatchewan and then considered Mines Department estimates.

The only flurry during the day occurred when Mr. G. H. Bolvin moved to strike out a vote of \$15,000 to provide specimens for the Victoria Museum. The motion was rejected by a standing vote of 24 to 16.

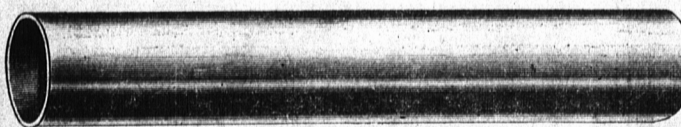
