OTTAWA, April 27 (CP)—The Polish Minister to Canada said today that if Canada does not return his country's art treasures, Poland would consider taking up the matter formally before the United Nations or the International Court of Justice.

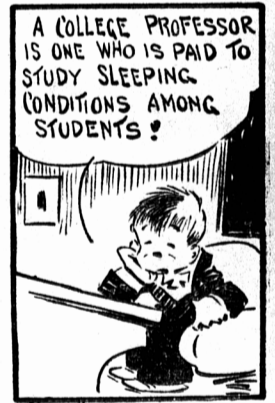
