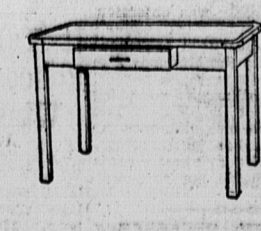
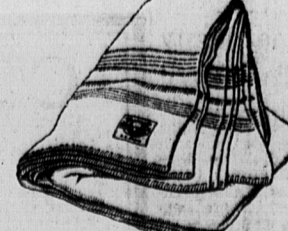
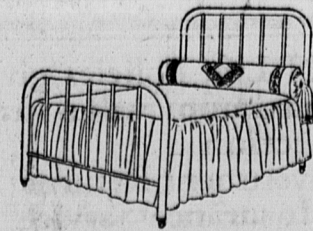

A second hand binder had been sold by the plaintiff to the defendant on the condition that the defendant would take the binder and try it and if it worked satisfactorily he would keep it and if not would return it. Defendant claimed it would not work after being given a fair trial and that it was useless to him, and he returned it. Judgment was given in favor of defendant. Geo. M.
