### NEWSY FARM NOTES

#### ELECTRIC LIGHTING

A well planned lighting system for the home will make more people happy and satisfied than any other electric service. Yet in spite of the wonderful progress this province has made in all things mechanic, in the last two decades, electric lighting still lags behind, and it is the exception to find the farm so lighted. This will come in time, however, either through the extension of power lines, or by the installation of individual plants operated singly or co-operatively.

Correct lighting for the farm is a specialized problem in itself, says the Missouri bulletin referred to in my last Notes. There are a few general principles of service, safety and convenience which must be observed.

No glaring lights should be permitted, for strong low hung lights are injurious to the eyesight. Reflect or shaded lamps will place 40 per cent more light where required than will the same size open lamps, and in the living room in particular soft shaded lights are desirable. Reading lamp shades should be open at the top to light the ceiling, yet deep enough to protect people passing through the room from a direct beam of light. When a central fixture is used it should throw diffused light from frosted globes.

Toggle wall switches, near the doors, save steps and prevent breakage of hanging fixtures, which can also be placed up out of the way of mechanical injury. Convenient wall or floor "plugs" should be installed for table conveniences—the vacuum cleaner, or the washing machine.

Three way switches should be installed on stairways or in long passages; these allow the lights to be turned off or on from either end. Lights on stairs should be so placed as to avoid casting shadows. Besides the central lighting fixture in the bedrooms, it is a great convenience to have wall bracket lamps on each side of the mirror.

The value of a yard light is best appreciated when the farmer comes home late from town. Yard lights should be easily accessible for repairs, and should be weather proof. Lock sockets for the bulbs are better than screw sockets for outside work. Three way switches are useful here, too.

In the poultry house the electric light changes the dark days into

working days for the hens. The ratio of 2-watt lamp capacity to 5 square feet of floor has given the best results.

All service buildings should be wired for lights and a stock of spare lamps kept on hand at all times, so reducing the fire hazard from oil lamps and matches.

#### WORMS IN SHEEP

An enquiry reached me the other day as to the remedy for worms in sheep and the enquirer had heard that bluestone was effective. Well, so it is against the Stomach Worm, the Hook Worm, and some of the Tape Worms, but there are others (which are, however, more prevalent in Western Canada than here) for which little can be done except changing the pastures yearly to prevent re-infection—a method recommended in any case and for all classes of live stock.

Dr. Lionel Stevenson, in his bulletin "Parasites Injurious to Sheep," (which I believe can be obtained at the Provincial Department of Agriculture), gives the following remedy which he characterizes as efficient and safe. Dissolve 4 (four) ounces of Copper Sulphate (bluestone) in two quarts of hot water, then add 4 ounces of mustard, mix thoroughly, and add two gallons more water, to bring the quantity up to two and a half Imperial gallons. This is enough to treat 100 sheep once.

The dosage is as follows: Adult sheep 3 to 4 fluid ounces; lambs 2 to 6 months old 1 to 1½ fluid ounces; lambs 6 to 10 months, 1½ to 2 fluid ounces; lambs 10 to 12 months, 2 to 2½ fluid ounces.

Starve sheep for at least 18 hours before giving drench and give no feed or water for at least 4 hours after dosing. The following suggestions are given where a veterinarian is not available. Keep the sheep on its feet, use a small necked bottle, or fit a metal tube to a nursing bottle that is marked off in ounces, measure the dose accurately, do not raise the sheep's mouth above the level of its eye, nor raise the head too high, give it time to swallow, treat gently and have the other sheep in sight close by. Lambs should be separated from the ewes for six hours before being dosed, and not allowed back with the ewes after drenching, until two hours have elapsed. The bulletin above mentioned should be in the hands of every farmer interested in raising sheep.

#### BROODY HENS

Three hens in my flock have elected to go broody at this untoward season, and so they are languishing "in durance vile," to bring them back into production as soon as possible. Placing hens in a slat-bottom coop in a cool place and feeding them a moistened mash will shorten the broody period. Plenty of fresh water and some green feed should be provided every day. Each time a hen becomes broody she should be leg-banded, for a hen carrying two or three leg-bands at the end of the year is not a profitable egg producer and should be disposed of.

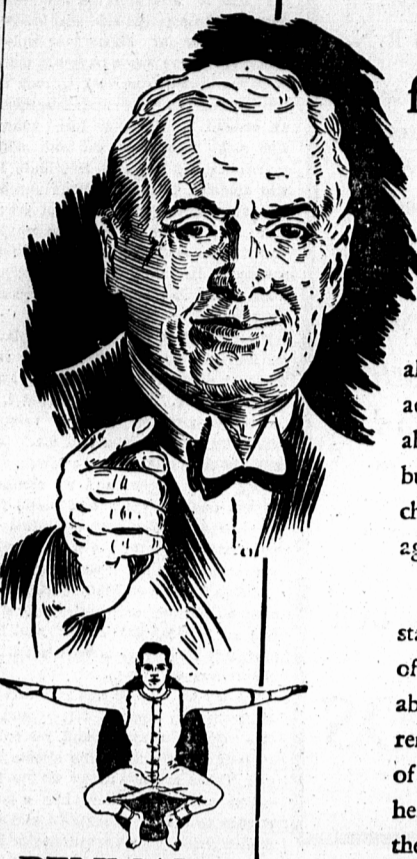
