CITY SCHOOLS CLOSED FOR SUMMER VACATION

Splendid Programmes Carried Out at Each. Addresses Delivered. List of Prize Winners.

City school vacation time is here once again, the time which brings rejoicing to the hearts of the boys and girls. There was a large attendance of parents and other visitors at the closing exercises of the several schools yesterday. Excellent and appropriate exercises were carried out at each. The trustees and other visitors were present. Reference was made at each of the schools to the Junior Chautauqua to be held in this city from June 22 to 28, at which the wish was expressed that all the scholars would endeavor to be present and help make it a success.

Mr. Henry Smith presided at Queen Square School and among those who spoke besides the chairman, were Premier Arsenault, Mayor Wright, Rev. Maurice McDonald, Rev. Father Poirier and Mr. T. C. James.

The addresses were of a high order of excellence, the key note being patriotism, perseverance, endurance and character.

The attendance at West Kent was the largest for some years. Dr. W. J. McMillan presided, and other speakers were Premier Arsenault, Mayor Wright, Rev. Dr. Fullerton, Rev. J. D. McKenzie, Rev. Father McDonald, Messrs. T. C. James, J. A. Webster, Lou A. Buckley, J. P. Gordon and Henry Smith, chairman of the School Board.

Mayor Wright offered a special prize in gold to the scholar making the highest marks in general proficiency in Grade 9. It was won by Wilma Johnson.

There was a very large attendance at Prince Street school, and an excellent program was carried out. Hon. Lt. Col. Jenkins, M.D., presided. The other speakers were Principal J. D. Seaman, who submitted an excellent report of the year's work, Mayor Wright, Rev. Father Poirier, Rev. Dr. Fullerton, Mr. Dawson and Mr. Jas. Paton, M.L.A., who offered an extra prize for the pupil writing the best essay telling how the holidays were spent.

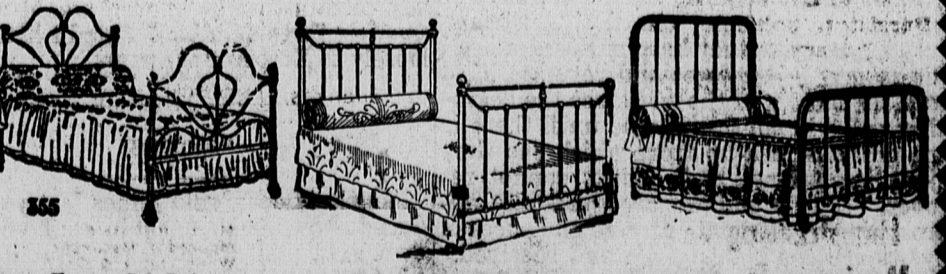
