The Annual Meeting Of Shareholders

The forty-third Annual Meeting of the Shareholders of The Canadian Bank of Commerce was held in the banking house, in Toronto, Jan 11th, at 12 o'clock. A large number of shareholders and others were present.

REPORT

The Directors beg to present to the Shareholders the forty-third Annual Report, covering the year ending 30th November, 1909, together with the usual Statement of Assets and Liabilities.

The balance at credit of Profit and Loss Account, brought forward from last year, was \$1,017,748.57. The net profit for the year ending 30th November, after providing for all bad and doubtful debts, amounted to \$1,017,748.57.

The assets of the Bank have all been carefully revalued in accordance with our customary practice, and all bad and doubtful debts have been amply provided for.

Your Directors deeply regret that they have to record the loss by death during the past year of two of their number, Mr. H. D. Warren, who died in March, and Mr. Matthew Leggat, who died only a few days ago. To fill the vacancy caused by Mr. Warren's death, your Directors have elected the Hon. J. M. Gibson, K. C., L. D., Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario.

For the purpose of making some provision for the widows and orphans of other dependents of officers of the Bank, your Directors propose to submit for your consideration a resolution authorizing the establishment of the necessary fund. ABANDONED HOPE. LONDON, Jan. 17.—Although both sides preserve confidence, it is evident that the Conservatives have abandoned the hope that their party will form the next Government. The utmost they expect is that the Liberal majority will be so reduced, in the next Parliament as to place the Liberals at the mercy of the Nationalists.

The polling tomorrow which include 31 London constituencies, and 57 Provincial Boroughs will provide a better index as to how the country is going. Should the Liberals retain the Metropolitan, which they gained in 1906, their prospects will be much rosier than now. At present, nothing is predicted with absolute certainty but only a very great increase in the Unionist gains over Saturday's results, when they gained only half the number of seats counted on will give them the victory. If the Unionists continue to gain in the same ratio the Liberals will still retain a majority in the neighborhood of ninety.
