ALFRED'S MILLENNIAL.

Interest in the coming millennial of Alfred the Great is increasing as the time approaches for the great celebration at Winchester the ancient capital of the Saxons. Winchester is near Southampton, and at Winchester Alfred held his court. He was born at Wantage, Berkshire, in the year 849, fifth and youngest son of Ethelwulf King of the West Saxons. Ethelwulf died, 858 and was succeeded in turn by three sons before Alfred came to the throne in 871. Alfred's story takes us well back toward the beginning of things in English monarchy, for Egbert, the first King of all England, was Alfred's grandfather and reigned but nineteen years. Alfred himself came to the throne at 22 years of age, reigned thirty years and died in October 899 aged 52 years. It is the thousandth anniversary of his death that is to be made the occasion of a noteworthy celebration.

Perhaps no man in the long line of English or of British sovereigns more truly deserved the honorary title of Great than King Alfred. It was he who by skill and valor defeated the Danes in successive wars and in many battles. On three hard fought fields in 871, at Ashdown, Basing and Merton, he fought under his brother, King Ethelred, against the common foe. At Wilton he commanded as King. So far it has been a defensive campaign. Seven years later he was still on the defensive, but conducted his warfare with so much skill and valor that a great victory was achieved at Ethandun. He followed up his advantage, re-organized the militia, built ships of war, and was the first to obtain a naval advantage over the Vikings. His reign was already approaching its close, when after hard warfare of three years he forced the final withdrawal of the enemy from his country in 901.

Alfred's administration was marked by judicial and educational reforms as great as his military achievements on land and sea. He compiled a code of laws, rebuilt the schools and monasteries destroyed by the Danes, and invited scholars from all the seats of learning to his court. He was himself a man of learning, and translated into Saxon a considerable number of the best religious, philosophical, and historical works of his time. His was a well rounded character in which courage and administrative ability of the first class were adorned by a noble manliness, true gallantry, great patience, unimpeachable integrity and love of truth. "Truth lover was our English Alfred's name," as Tennyson has sung. The secretary of the Celebration Committee, who is also the present Mayor of Winchester, speaks of Alfred as "one who more than any other may be regarded as our greatest common ancestor, and in times past the most perfect hero of the whole English-speaking race."

It is well that the name and fame of this far-off noble ancestor and his illustrious example should be now and hereafter frequently recalled for the instruction and emulation of our people. It is indeed a far call back to the days of Alfred—70 years before the days of Chaucer, even—and at the beginning of that era of a thousand years during which our flag has braved the battle and the breeze. But his illustrious deeds and noble worth are undimmed by the lapse of ages and are now recalled with pride and veneration by nations mightier than any of which Alfred had ever dreamed; nations which have girdled the earth with the fame and the language of England.
