Supreme Court Fox and Fur Notes

The Supreme Court opened at Georgetown on Tuesday, Mr. Justice Fitzgerald on the Bench. There were no criminal cases and his Lordship was presented with a pair of white gloves. He commented on the gratifying absence of crime and the splendid record which King's County has had in this regard.

There were four jury cases and two non-jury cases on the docket. The first civil case is that of Lar kin vs. Whitty, the parties belonging to Fortune Road. The plaintiff is suing the defendant, who is a married man, for the loss of services on account of alleged seduction of his adopted daughter, Bentley, K. C., is counsel for the plaintiff, Hon. J. J. Johnston, K. C., for defendant. This case was before the court all day yesterday. Another case is that of Mellish vs. Kaneen, action of trespass on land; Johnson, K. C. for plaintiff; D. A. McKinnon, defendant. At the opening of the court on motion of Mr. J. D. Stewart, an order was made admitting Claire Campbell as a student in the law office of A. C. Saunders, Summerside. The Grand Jury, of which M. J. Campbell was foreman in their report called attention to the need of repairing the basement and roof of the jail.
