In the death of Cartney MacClure, which took place at Murray River early Friday morning, 14th the community has suffered the loss of one of its oldest and most respected residents. The deceased, who was the son of William MacClure and his wife Jean Boyd, was born in Mauchline, Ayrshire, Scotland, on May 10th, 1828. He emigrated with his parents to Murray Harbor North in 1840. A. about fifty years ago he removed with his brother, Gavin MacClure, to Murray River, where they carried on an extensive ship-building and mill business, as well as general store. In those early times it was an unusual thing for the firm of MacClure Brothers to build a ship, load her with island produce and dispose of both ship and cargo in Britain. With the decline of the shipbuilding industry, greater attention was given to the other departments of the firm's business. Some eight years ago Gavin MacClure passed away. The deceased was a man of generous mould, charitable in his judgment, ever ready to find fault and ever ready to commend the deserving. He was a staunch supporter of the Liberal Party and delighted to recall the campaigns of bygone days and express his admiration for the leaders. Every good cause found in him a loyal supporter. Besides a wide circle of friends he leaves to mourn one son, Mr. Matthew MacClure, of Dover, and one sister, Mrs. David McLeod, of Murray River.—Com.
