The Latest News From Prince County.

EIGHTY people took advantage of the special from Summerside to Emerald last night to attend the entertainment.

The paper for having the Central Creamery incorporated was completed at a meeting held in the office of Messrs J. S. Read, & Co., on Saturday.

The entertainment to be given by the Crystal Hockey Club for the benefit of the Public Library will take place in Crystal Rink on Friday evening next and will consist of a series of races including a chair race, potato race, hurdle race, etc. After the performance the spectators will be given an hours skate.

A recent issue of the Quincy, Mass., Daily Ledger announces that "Mr. E. A. Bryan of the Weeks-Hill Pharmacy, Quincy, is now a full fledged Pharmacist, having passed his examinations." An adjourned meeting of the Town Council was held last evening, Mayor McNeill and all the councillors present. The Hall committee reported the market hall in bad condition and recommended considerable repair. The report was received and the committee authorized to have the necessary repairs made to be done by tender. Two tenders for the hauling of the steam fire engine Beaver were read, from Mrs. McDonald and Mr. J. D. Perry, for \$100 and \$75 per year respectively. The committee appointed to enquire into the cost of purchasing two horses for the town submitted estimates and the matter was discussed at some length. The matter was laid over for one week. The following tender for the proposed repairs to the Market Building were submitted:

On motion it was decided to accept the lowest tender, also that Mr. W. P. Baker, be appointed to superintend the work at ten per cent of the contract price. After the discussion of some minor matters the council adjourned.
