PROBLEMS IN SOUTH AFRICA.

(Continued from Page One.)

1914 that the Dutch people as a whole are essentially conservative and cautious. After 300 lives were lost the "strike" was put down and even the radicals flocked to General Smuts' standard in the successful effort to restore order. As a result of the strike failure the white miner today gets half the wages he formerly did and it is felt rather widely that the mine owner has got the "knife" into his white brother and is turning it around too much. On the other hand the native workers who took no part in the disturbance feel that a great gain has been secured. Hence there is a three-cornered fight between selfishness and idealism as existing in the Canadian industrial problem and another idealism of the superiority of the white man, which is being threatened by the lifting of the "color bar".

Three Possibilities

There are, the speaker said, three possible results of this conflict between the races. On one hand the natives may practically become enslaved and be made to work as serfs. Or they may be given equality and justice, which if practicable would be the best solution. The third possibility is that the racial barriers will go down altogether. In that event it will simply be a matter of time before South Africa will again be inhabited by colored people only. The problem at present seems an insoluble one, but Mr. Cotton did not believe there was reason to be pessimistic. He had faith in the destiny of the country and in the healing touch of time. He concluded his very able address with some interesting remarks about General Smuts, who he declared has little patience with sensation mongers, and would certainly not tolerate a Ku Klux Klan in South Africa.
