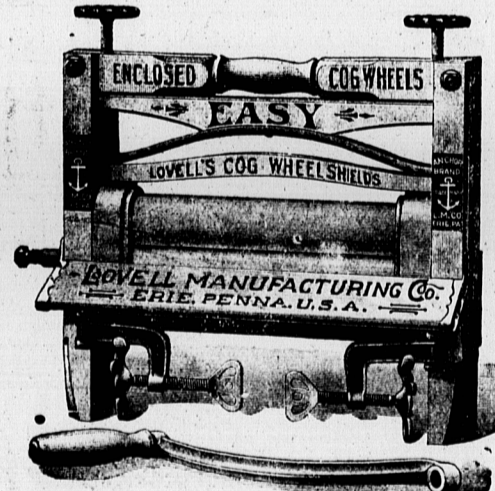

WINTER SAILINGS TO BOSTON ANNOUNCED

Eastern S.S. Company's Plans Made Known To-day Austin to Be Overhauled.

Commencing on Wednesday, November 10, the Eastern Steamship Company will inaugurate their winter schedule of sailings. After that date there will be two sailings each week, the service being performed by the big turbine Governor Cobb. She will leave St John for Boston Wednesdays at 8 a. m., calling at Eastport and Portland, and on Saturdays at 7 p. m. for Boston direct.

Sailings from Boston will be made on Mondays and Fridays at 9 a. m. On the Monday trip she will call at Portland, Eastport, and Lunenburg, and on Fridays will stop at Eastport only.

The arrangement for having a Saturday night direct trip from St John will doubtless be appreciated by the travelling public, as it enables passengers to reach Boston on Sunday afternoon, thus losing very little time.

The Calvin Austin will leave St. John on Monday, Nov. 8, on her last trip of the season. On arriving in Boston she will be laid up for repairs and a thorough overhauling.

RHODES SCHOLARS HELP EMIGRATION

LONDON, Eng.—Nov 8.—Messrs Kingsley and Fairbridge, Oxford Rhodes scholars, who with others have formed a society to further the emigration of poor children, say they have been offered 50,000 acres of land in Newfoundland and grants of money in aid, but the education they propose giving will need a considerable foundation fund.

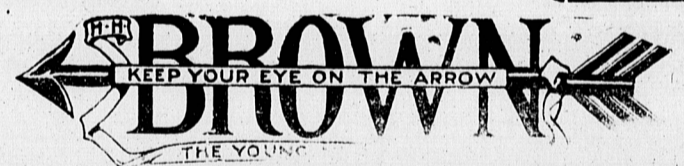

OYSTERS STEWED.

Not oyster stew, if you please! It was never called that in the olden times, and I don't believe it has that name applied to it at the south, even now.

Add a half-pint of hot water to the liquor drained from two quarts of oysters. Put a little salt and pepper with it, set over the fire and let it boil up once. Turn in the oysters and let them cook for not more than five minutes, or until the gills begin to crimp. Watch carefully for this stage, as every second beyond it means injury to the flavor of the oyster. Add two tablespoonfuls of butter and a large cupful of boiling milk. Take from the fire immediately and serve as soon as possible. Never let them stand at the back of the stove and keep warm unless you prefer them tough and tasteless.—The Delineator for December.
