The prompt answering of the children in the different subjects and the tasteful manner in which the little hands had so nicely decorated the school for the occasion goes to show that the program made by them has been in a satisfactory direction. At the close of the examination remarks were made by A. K. Henry expressing the entire satisfaction of all present as to the advancement of the pupils and congratulating the children for their tasteful decorations. Geo. Morris then followed with some pleasing remarks congratulating in return the rate payers and trustees for the comfortable and up-to-date school house they now have, after undergoing a thorough renovation during the past year. Master Benj. Taylor read the following address, which expresses the sentiments of the scholars for itself. Master John Taylor on behalf of the school made the presentation of a very nice gift to the teacher. The following is the address:— Dear Teacher: We are indeed sorry to learn that you intend leaving us at the close of this school year. We, therefore, cannot allow you to go without conveying to you in some way our sorrow at your departure from us. We have been under your care as scholars for the past four years and you have not only taught us to read and write, but you have taught us to love and respect you; and although doing your duty you have been kind and loving all the while, and ready to help us when we could not help ourselves. We now wish to thank you for the kindness and love you have shown us in the past and as we are now about to part we trust that the blessing of God may follow you through life; and if we all shall never meet again on earth may we meet in that home where parting is unknown. Please accept this small gift as a token of our respect for you. Signed on behalf of the scholars, June 30, 1905. Miss Simpson, although taken entirely by surprise responded in a very pleasing manner, thanking the children one and all for their thoughtfulness, not only at this time but at all times during her stay with them. In a very touching manner the children all bade their teacher "Good bye." Miss Simpson leaves on July 13th. for Regina, Assa.

HUMAN SKELETON FOUND.

Stnovo, Me., July 2.—County officials today viewed the skeleton of the man discovered by a party of fishermen in the woods two miles above Carrabasset, but will not decide about an inquest until tomorrow. Dr. E. L. Pennell, of Kingsfield, who examined the bones said the skull is not fractured. The upper jaw is in good shape except one tooth is missing, but the lower jaw was not found. The skeleton is that of a man six feet in height. Two theories have been advanced as to the identity of the man—that he was a river driver who disappeared three years ago and probably became lost and died from exhaustion, or was the Eastie citizen who escaped from the State insane asylum at Augusta about four years ago. The clothing, except for the boots, a small piece of a woolen shirt and a portion of a pair of trousers had rotted away.

Del Rio, Tex., July 1.—Unprecedented rains supplemented by a cloud burst near the head of Las Vacas creek, a small stream on the Mexican side, have resulted in the known death by drowning of eighteen persons, sixteen of whom were Mexicans, and the probable death of many more.
