PLUM PUDDING THAT THE CHILDREN CAN EAT

Two and one-half cups of stale bread crumbs, one cup of scalded milk, three-quarters cup of sugar, four eggs, one cup of raisins, one cup of figs, one-half cup of dates, two tablespoons of flour, one-quarter cup of candied orange or citron peel, one-half pound of suet, one-quarter cup of grape juice or orange juice, one-half grated nutmeg, one-half teaspoon each of cinnamon, cloves and mace; one teaspoon of salt, one teaspoon extract of lemon.

Pour hot milk over bread crumbs, add sugar and salt and leave until cool; then add yolks of eggs well beaten, raisins, figs and dates, all chopped coarsely. Chop suet fine, sifting the flour over it to facilitate the chopping, then cream it with the spices and fruit juice, and add to the bread mixture. Flavor with the lemon extract and fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites. Turn into a buttered and floured mould, cover and steam six hours. Leave the pudding in the mould after steaming, and just before serving retreat it.

Serve with orange-flavored hard sauce.

NEW WOOLLEN MILL PLANNED FOR YORK

TORONTO, Dec. 16—Yesterday it was made known that about three acres of land has been secured in York Township, and upon which a large up-to-date woollen mill is likely to be erected in the near future.

While the name of the concern is for the present time withheld, it is understood that members of the York Industrial Commission have for some considerable time been negotiating the matter. The firm whose representatives have on several occasions met the Commission is said to have its headquarters abroad.

Said to be one of the world's largest woollen concerns, the decision to locate a plant in York Township has given considerable satisfaction in the municipality, where recently the unemployment situation has been one of the worst in the Province.

At the present time another large concern engaged in the manufacture of confectioneries is erecting a plant on Bude Street, while a construction firm is erecting a plant on Hopewell Avenue, and recently a permit was issued for a new planing mill on Kenwood Avenue.

POLITICIANS BLAMED FOR SPREAD OF CRIME

ALBANY, N. Y. Dec. 16—Political interference and domineering have reduced the efficiency of police departments to about 15 per cent, with the result that criminals are running rampant without fear of the law, declared Assemblyman Burton D. Esmond, Rep., Saratoga county, vice-chairman of the Baumes crime commission, in a statement issued here to-day.

Esmond's statement was inspired by revelations of vicious practices in New York city police circles and by news that Detroit gangsters are now using armored automobiles in their operations.

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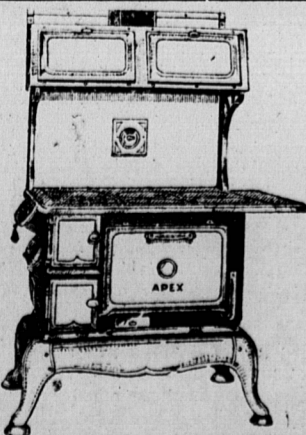
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
