Council Requests More Data On Rink Project

The Summerside Town Council again passed the matter of the proposed new artificial ice rink and community centre back to the Citizens' Ways and Means Committee at the regular meeting of the Town Council last evening.

The resolution to this effect was moved by Councillor H. B. Schurman and seconded by Councillor Gerald Sheen and reads as follows: "Resolved that the citizens' ways and means committee be asked to supply data re the cost of a new artificial ice rink and community centre; also data as to cost of all type rinks recently built in other centres; also data as to what is required in a community centre."

Other Business
A letter was read from the Island Telephone Co. Ltd. advising the Town that after the dial system is installed and working it would not be possible for the Telephone office to operate the police and fire alarms as at present.

Views of Councillors

Councillor T. D. Morrison said that before the plebiscite is taken, if it is decided to hold one, the citizens should be told just what the rink is going to cost and how much of an increase in taxes will be necessary.

Councillor Henry Wedge said he didn't think that enough information is being asked for. He said that a number of people think a natural ice rink should be built now and later on artificial ice equipment could be added.

The December meeting of the Long River W. I. met at the home of Mrs. Wm. Johnstone at the vice-president in the chair in the absence of the president, and opened by singing the Ode and repeating creed in unison.

Councillor J. L. Gorrell said, "we are all talking big money. We will do well if we get a rink." He didn't think a community centre should be considered at all.

Councillor Schurman also agreed with this view saying that what is needed is a rink. Mayor Arnett said that the matter would finally be decided by the Council. If the committee bring in unreasonable proposals the Council will not act on them.

Reporting for the street committee, Councillor Wedge said that the committee is negotiating with a party who owns a 35 h.p. tractor to rent it for the winter months.

Councillor Morrison, for the light committee, said that some delay had occurred in the arrival of plans for the extension to the electric light plant but they have now arrived and tenders have been called.

Councillor Morrison said that there has been some controversy on the matter of change in the oil in one engine at the plant and he wanted to say for the record that he knew nothing of the change till five weeks after it had been made.

Councillor Schurman said that the Fire Department pumper, an old A.R.P. piece of equipment, is broken and about worn out.

Councillor Schurman said that a natural ice rink would be no good. "We are in December now and no hope of ice yet. With artificial ice rink we would have ice in November."

Councillor Morrison said that the Council was placing quite a burden on this committee. "Surely we know what we want or if we don't we will have to make up our minds and tell the citizens what

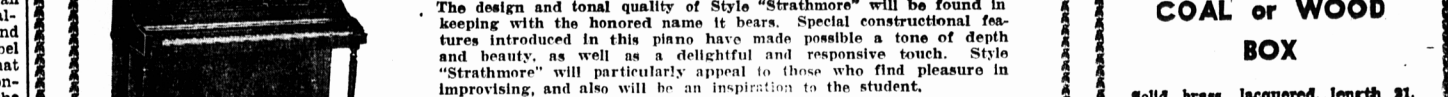
