THE KIRK PULPIT

Preaching at a service of National Thanksgiving in the Kirk yesterday morning on the text: "Make us glad according to the days wherein Thou hast afflicted us, and the years wherein we have seen evil" (Psalm 90:15), the minister, the Rev. T.H. Bussell Somers, said: And now we face a new era, fraught with both tremendous possibilities and grave dangers. It is hardly to be expected that there will be very many swift transitions. Even when the prisoner has been delivered from his fetters, his limbs are stiff and sore where they have fretted him, and that is and will be the condition of multitudes in every land and from varying causes.

Therefore at the dawn of world peace it may be well for us to ponder these things. We shall be living soon in days when decisions, standards and ideas will matter tremendously, and we must determine the principles on which those decisions shall be made, those standards erected, those ideas based, those votes recorded and those actions founded. There is, we are told, much Christianity in the air, but you can no more get Christianity out of the air without the Church than you can get music out of the air without the receiving set. That is why Thomas Carlyle, in his "French Revolution," exclaims that man was blessed who belonged to the Church, and who amid the breaking of foundations, had the eternal rock under his feet, and that was why walking with his American friend on a Scottish hillside he cried, with a catch in his breath "Emerson, Jesus Christ died on Calvary, and that fact built Dunscore Church yonder!" It is so strange that we accept the mind of Christ—or think we do—until we get to politics, economics, or international and social relationships. Surely, unless the Christian way of life runs through these things, it ceases to be a way of life, and becomes only a mode of thought—without connection with human betterment or individual service. When we pray passionately, not perfunctorily—"Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth" we have true devotion to Him Whose Cross has risen again before the eyes of our generation, set there once more by the sins of the world, but able, if we will let it, to reconcile us to God and to each other and in the effectiveness of that reconciliation will lie the happiness and security of the peace that now is ours.

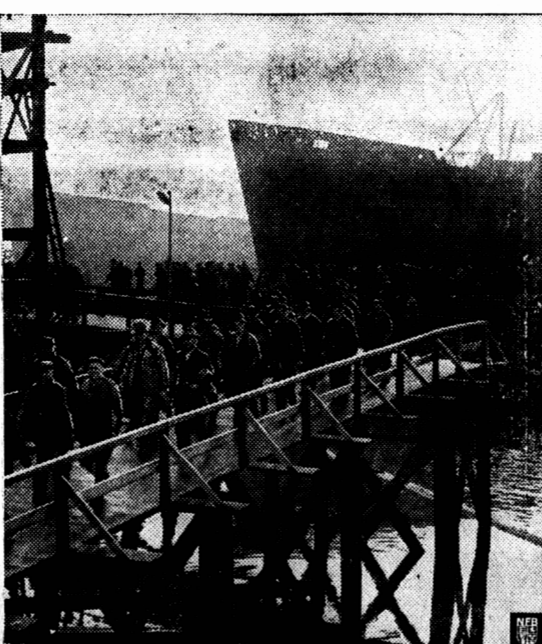

Study of Dominion-Provincial Post-War Action To Highlight National Reconstruction Conference Sessions



Plan to Keep Employment Level High . . . Aid Small Industry . . . and Train Ex-Service Personnel
Greater co-operation between the Dominion and provincial governments of Canada, particularly in regard to the vital post-war matters on which definite action will be planned, is the aim of the National Reconstruction Conference at Ottawa. Chief topics of the Ottawa sessions will be plans for maintaining a high level of employment, absorbing men and women of the armed forces into gainful employment, and reconverting industries to peacetime production, with special attention to possible aid to the smaller industries.
