HEAVY JAPANESE ATTACK LONDON, August 8—(Special)—It is reported that the Russians north of Hai Cheng have suffered a heavy attack.

BRITISH REACH LHASA LHASA, Tibet, August 3—(delayed in transmission.) The British expedition is encamped a mile from the Sacred Mountain of Potalo, on which is situated the Dalai Lama's Palace and in the immediate vicinity of the Dalai Lama's private garden.

THE GRAND LAMA FLED The Dalai Lama fled to a monastery some miles distant. It is reported he has shut himself up in a strict seclusion on a mountain top, the highest state officers and declaring he will remain secluded for three years.

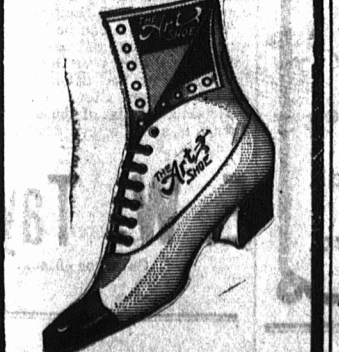

INFORMATION IS TO BE PROCURED

Regarding Cost of an Electric Light Plant

This was Decided at a Meeting of the Council Last Night—Other Business Done.

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held last evening, the Mayor and all the Councillors being present.

Before passing the minutes of last meeting some discussion ensued regarding the payment of a bill included in the minutes. The minutes were approved of. Communications were read from The R. V. Pringle Co., Ltd., St. John, quoting prices on fixtures for lighting; from John Bolser complaining that the surface water flooded his cellar; from Hugh Monaghan intimating that the hatch placed in front of his building at Queen must not be disturbed while the new concrete sidewalk was being laid on pain of action for damages; from T. H. Drake offering \$100 for two days weekly for stall in market at right side of the south door; from the City Weigher asking for increased salary; from H. P. Mills, meat merchant, asking that refund of \$25 for license fee for selling meat be refunded or the tax conferred against all the butchers; from Von Clure Gay a king at the cellar under his stall in the new market be completed as others and pointing out that a heat opposite his stall entrance would be a hindrance to his business; from Councillors D. J. Riley, D. O. M. Reddin and P. S. Brown recommending Eugene Hornsby as city stenographer at a salary of not exceeding \$100. The communication re stenographer was ordered to lie on the table. Von Clure Gay's request re market cellar was referred to the market committee. The salary of R. K. Brace, city weigher was increased from \$235 to \$245 to take effect August 1st.

OTTAWA, Aug. 8—(Special)—The Minister of Marine has decided to build reduction plants one on the north shore of New Brunswick, another on the southern coast of Cape Breton and a third probably at the Magdalen Islands to use dogfish. The Government will operate them.

LOBSTER BOAT RACE YESTERDAY

Declared Off Because of Lack of Wind The Boats Started in a Fair Breeze which Dropped, However, as they Proceeded.

There was much interest in the lobster boat race yesterday and a pretty scene was presented as the boats crossed the line at the raising of the flag on the Aquila.

The entries were as follows:— George A.—Francis Doherty. Onward—Jas. Taylor. Example—Dan Taylor. Volunteer—Herbert Huestis. Girt—James Lund. Maple Leaf—Jos. Lund. Lou Dill—Neil Stewart. Stranger—Jas. Judson. May Flower—Ernest McInnis. Sophia May—Jas. W. Taylor. The course was up to the Bridge, thence to Battery Point, round West River Buoy, to North River Buoy and thence back to Peake's Wharf, twice round. The course was 15 miles.

The boats got away at 11.28. Frank Doherty's in the lead with a light south west breeze blowing. The boats kept well together but when near the harbor's mouth the wind died down and they returned to the wharf as it was evident that they could not finish within the time limit.

The George A. Doherty, maintained her lead, holding it well and rounding the harbor buoy, by a very good space. The Grit, James Lund, being second; the Stranger, third; Onward, fourth, and the Mayflower, fifth. From the harbor buoy to the West and North River the boats changed positions some, the Mayflower rassing the George A., and the Stranger taking second place.

The remainder of the contest in to the wharf was a drifting match. Mayflower McInnis, being first; Volunteer, H. Huestis, second; Stranger, third, and Grit, fourth. The race will be sailed again next Monday at 10 o'clock.
