### THAT CAR OF YOURS

This is a series of articles pertaining to maintenance and repair of your Automobile. We will be glad to answer through this column, questions regarding your car or its mechanism.

The duty of the high tension coil on your car is to transform six volt primary current into secondary high tension current of an extremely high voltage.

On an coil except vibrator coils, this high tension current is produced by induction. The primary current is sent through a primary winding of heavy wire on an iron core; around this winding is wound some hundreds of turns of very fine secondary wire, it is called the secondary winding.

When the primary winding is "saturated" with current (this being controlled by the breaker points) the secondary winding of fine wire induces the current from the primary winding into itself, and is thereby transformed into high tension current. This current is collected by the rotor arm in the distributor and distributed to the plugs.

A condenser is shunted usually in the coil to absorb excess current to prevent arcing at the distributor points, and a safety gap placed in series with ground through which the spark may jump in case of an open circuit to ground in any of the operating lines.

If this gap were not present the coil would heat and burn out, as the induced current must reach ground and its high pressure re-leases by jumping a gap.

Common coil troubles are as follows:—Punctured condenser; broken-down secondary winding; shorted; open circuit in primary winding, and bad ground connection on base of coil.

QUES.—The clutch in my Car slips. It is a plate clutch. Do you know the adjustment on it?

ANS.—The adjustment in this clutch is made by removing inspection cover on clutch housing and slackening two studs which can be seen in two slots in the face plate of the clutch. One will be at the top, at the inspection plate, the other at the bottom.

It will be necessary to turn the engine after loosening the top stud, so that the bottom stud will come to the top. When these are loose, depress clutch and with a hammer tap the stud which is now at the top, to the right facing the motor ¼ or ½ of an inch. Tighten studs and replace inspection door.

MANICURE.
