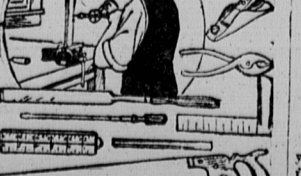

THE WAR IN CHINA

(Special to the Guardian)
TSINATO, Shantung, China, July 3—Most of the interior of the rich Province of Shantung with a population of 30,000,000 is in the hands of the Northern Armies. Han Fu Chu, Nankin's commander has retreated eastward from Tsinanfu to Weihai on the railway which is only 100 miles westward of Thingao. Han Fu Chu's army a year ago numbered 90,000, but today it has dwindled to 25,000, though his force still constitute a menace to Yen Hsi. Shens left flank at Yen pushed southward in his drive toward Suchowu and Nankin. The Provincial Government Archives have been sent here and a temporary capital in rivalry to Tainanfu has been established in the University building.

There has been no trouble here in view of the great number of foreign warships in the harbor. It is believed that if Han Fu Chu is pushed further to the coast he will seize Chinese vessels to transport his army southward to Haichow, the eastern terminus of the Lungtai Railway exchange and the mounting prices.

and will rejoin the Nankin forces from there. If Han Fu Chu evacuates, it is possible that gunboats of the Manchurian navy may attempt to grab the customs as they have done at Chingwantao instead of permitting the northerners to duplicate the Tsientsin seizure. If this is done by Admiral Chen under Mukden's orders, it will not be interpreted as a gesture friendly to Nankin nor as one hostile to the Northerners, but as a mere continuation of the gradual extension southward of the Manchurian sphere of influence at the expense of the battling factions. Foreign and Chinese business here is dead owing to the war, the adverse terminus of the Lungtai Railway exchange and the mounting prices.
