POSTAL CAR BURNED.—On Tuesday afternoon the combined postal and second class car attached to the Souris train, while approaching Ashton about 5 p. m. caught fire from the explosion of an oil lamp in the postal section. The burning oil scattered in all directions. The mail clerk Mr. J. F. McLeod fortunately escaped with a few slight burns. A portion of the mail was saved but other parcels, papers and registered mail for Souris were destroyed in the fire. The burning car which could not be saved was detached and run on a siding at Ashton. The mail clerk lost some personal effects including a suit of clothes.

SHIPPING.—It looked very much at one time that wharf work would be at a premium at Montague this fall, the whole water front being filled with vessels, of various sizes. During the past week over sixteen vessels loaded full cargoes of general produce and cleared for their home ports. Mostly Newfoundland, very few from Nova Scotia. McLeod & McGregor, Pooly & Thompson, and Wm. McLeish & Sons, are the principal shippers. The beautiful weather of the past few weeks was of inestimable value to the farmer, and seems to have come expressly for him. The farmers in this vicinity have apparently come to the conclusion that prices have reached their highest for this fall, and are hauling quite freely. The potato crop reported a good one, and with the price at forty-five cents per bushel, ought to greatly help in equipping the farmer for the hardships sustained during the past few years. Turnips are also offering quite freely at twenty cents or bushel. Oats forty-five. In addition among the vessels now in port and which will all be loaded by the week end, is a fairly large steamer from Nova Scotia, a new type of craft for the produce business in these waters. J.

SWEDEN IMPORTS RUSSIAN ASPEN WOOD FOR MATCHES.—Stockholm, Nov. 7.—The assumption on a large scale of the shipment of aspen wood from Russia to Sweden, just reported on by Svensk Finansstämning (Swedish Financial Journal), has aroused great interest here. According to the authorities, 8,000,000 board feet of aspen wood have been imported from Russia during the first nine months of this year, as against less than half of that quantity during last year. One of these shipments of aspen wood have been brought by the Swedish Match Company, which consumes about 120,000,000 board feet per year in its domestic and foreign factories, and it is an ironical fact that much of this wood comes from the forest properties formerly owned in Russia by the Swedish Match Company and confiscated by the Bolsheviks.
