NO DANGER SAYS PROFESSOR PICKERING



BOSTON, Mass., Nov. 25—If the earth should pass through the tail of Halley's comet May 19 next, according to Professor William Henry Pickering of the Harvard Observatory, no harm will come to this planet, owing to the diaphanous character of the tail, which is probably composed of dust or very small mineral particles. "Though the death will exert a small attraction on the comet, the comet's attraction on the earth will be inappreciable. "The head may be unusually large, though one can never tell about those things. It may come very near to us, nearer, perhaps, that it did in 1835. If the tail is thirteen million miles long we shall pass through the tail of the comet on May 19. It is not to be expected that such an event will alter weather conditions in any way. Scientific men are looking forward with eagerness to the event. Just what will be learned that is not already known I cannot tell. Something unexpected may be hoped for by which the whole world will profit."
