Accompany Big Bombers Over Invasion Bases

Spitfires and Hurricanes keep skies clear while barges blasted—Few Nazi craft over Britain.

LONDON, Feb. 2.—(CP)—More than 100 Spitfire and Hurricane fighters and a large number of bombers crossed the English Channel today in a new daylight aerial offensive against the German-held coast from which the Nazis are expected to try to invade Britain in the spring.
