MR. RICHARD C. A. GRANT

In the death of Mr. Richard Clement Albion Grant which occurred at his home on Water Street yesterday forenoon, Charlottetown has lost another of its most prominent business men and an excellent citizen. Mr. Grant had been in failing health for some time, and it was only his indomitable spirit which made him bear up as he did to the last. Deceased was born at Earnsccliffe, Oct. 21st, 1869 and was therefore only in his fiftieth year. He was associated in the grocery business in his early manhood with his father the late Mr. Wm. Grant and upon the death of the latter he assumed charge of the business, and some time later sold out to Mr. R. F. Maddigan and went into the agricultural implement business still maintaining the old firm name of Wm. Grant & Co. Mr. Grant conducted this business for 23 years very successfully. A year ago he took into partnership Mr. Samuel Kennedy, Jr. and the business was then conducted under the firm name of Grant & Kennedy. Since the recent fire which visited their premises Mr. Grant sold out his interest. Some eighteen years ago the deceased met with an accident from the effects of which he never fully recovered and which doubtless had much to do with shortening his days. While doing an act of charity for a poor man, as he often did for many, he made a misstep, falling down the elevator shaft in his place of business a distance of 26 feet. He lay unconscious at that time for three hours before being found. He sustained severe internal injuries as the result. The late Mr. Grant served two terms in the City Council and was 14 years chairman of the board of assessors, a position which he was obliged to resign this year owing to his health. He was a charter member of the local K. of C. and C.M.B.A. and stood high in the estimation of the members of these bodies. He took much interest in the welfare of Charlottetown and did all he could to promote its interests. Charitable to the poor and devoted to his family he will be much missed. He leaves to cherish his memory his wife, (formerly Miss Clara E. Hogan, daughter of the late Mr. M. P. Hogan, of this city,) two daughters, Mrs. A.J. McNis, of Earnsccliffe, and Richardina and Earl, the latter two at home, to all of whom deepest sympathy is extended.

IN MEMORIAM

On the morning of Oct 23rd last there passed away at his home one of Valleyfield's most respected citizens in the person of the late Lachlan MacPherson in the 72nd year of his age. While working outside he caught a cold which gradually grew worse and a last developed into pneumonia. From the time that pneumonia attacked him the prospects of his recovery were very small and he himself was perfectly reconciled to the inevitable. He died towards the last his ardent prayer was that the Lord might see fit to hasten the time of his departure. He was a quiet and unassuming disposition and kind withal. One got the impress on one meeting him that he was a man worthy of confidence, a true friend and lover of all that is noble and good. He made those coming to his home heartily welcome, feel at ease and enjoy his hospitality. No one could be much in his genial company without feeling the better of it. He was a consistent member of Valleyfield Presbyterian Church for over thirty years where his presence was always a welcome and a cheer. He is missed in his family and district and also in his church for his seat is empty. He has gone to his rest and the Lord he loved, and he has left for his stricken family and community, the memory of a blameless life, to comfort them in their sorrow and to inspire them to live as he did. The funeral service which was largely attended was conducted by his pastor, Rev. J. M. MacLeod. The sympathy of friends near and far is with his poor invalid widow and his children. And to add to their sorrow news reached them of the death of the eldest son, Alexander, in the West two weeks after the death of the father.
