Denials Made of Alleged Bribery of Hon. Mr. Bowser

VICTORIA, B. C., Feb. 28.—Categorical denials by Brigadier-General J. A. Stewart, formerly of the Pacific Great Eastern Contracting firm of Foley, Welch and Stewart and by D'Arcy Tate, K. C., one-time general legal counsel for the railway, that they had any knowledge of the alleged bribes of \$50,000 each to both W. J. Bowser, K. C., and Hon. W. M. Sloan, Minister of Mines, in connection with campaign funds for the Conservative and Liberal parties at the 1916 general election, were among the outstanding features of the second day's proceedings in the inquiry before Mr. Justice Gallagher today into the corruption charges made by the provincial parties.

Evidence of Premier Oliver, who occupied the witness stand for the greater part of the session, was mainly a reiteration of his statements yesterday that he knew nothing at all of the alleged payments to Messrs. Bowser and Sloan, that he had tried to make the best settlement possible for P. G. E. Affairs in 1916 and 1917 and that he had agreed to the settlement eventually made because he believed it was in the best interests of the Province.
