### PETERS ROAD AND VICINITY

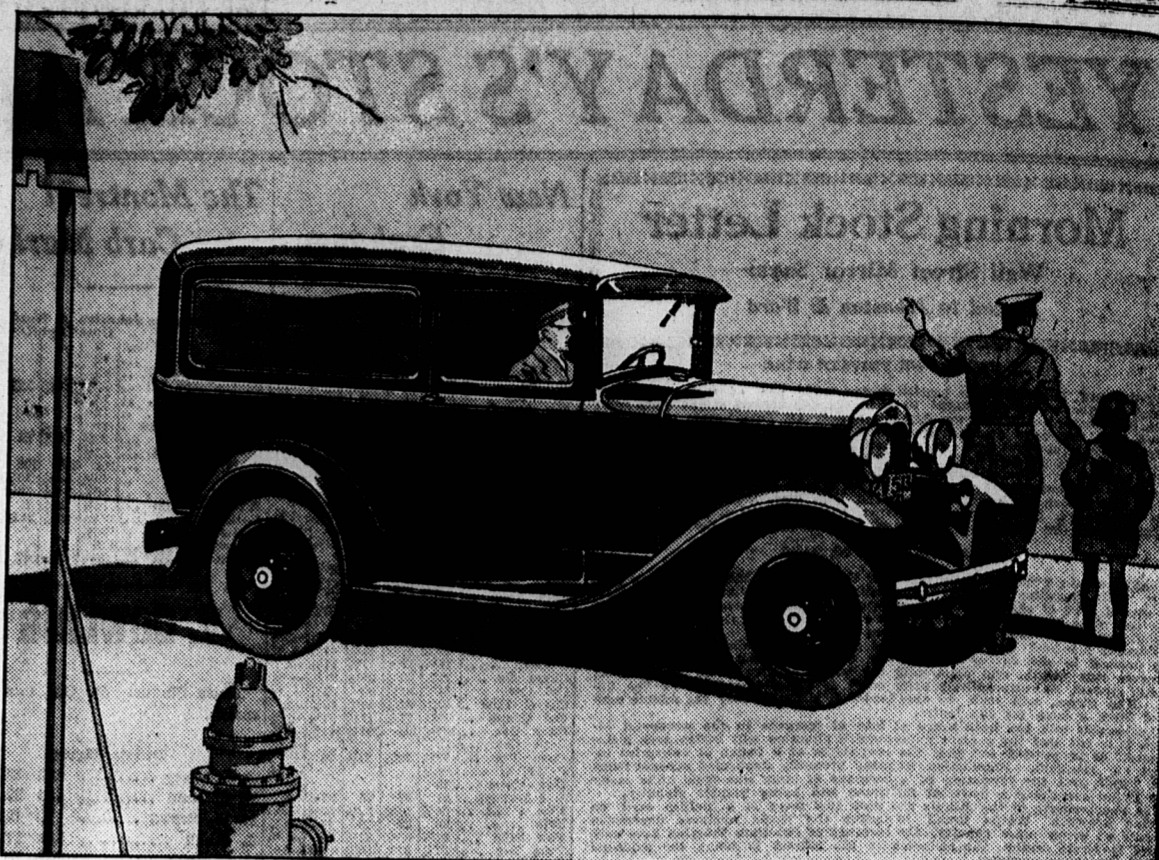

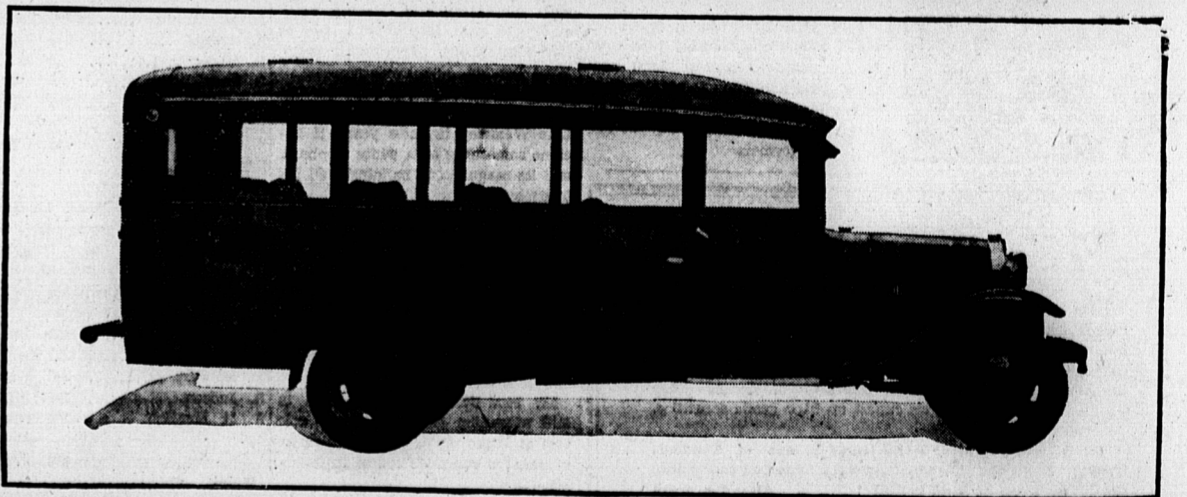
