ILLINOIS HENS HAVE BEGUN TO LAY, THINKING MID-JANUARY IS SPRING

CHICAGO, Jan. 20.—What have you seen? One is that when there are numerous volcanic eruptions, the sun gets to do with the price of eggs and the rate of speculation. Do they have an effect upon the weather, then in turn influence hens in their production of shell eggs? These questions were settled by Prof. Henry J. Cox, Meteorologist in charge of the weather observatory here. Why has the central portion of North America been enjoying such mild weather this winter? What ever the cause, it is a fact that the hens have thought Spring was here and have begun laying with a vengeance. There are two theories the meteorologist explained, but neither of them has been proved. One is that when there are numerous volcanic eruptions, the smoke and fine particles are spread like a mist through the atmosphere and absorb some of the sun's emanations before they reach the earth. This makes a cold. There have been very few volcanoes in action this year, consequently no smoke screen and the earth has been getting the benefit of all Old Sol's rays giving moderate temperature for this time of the year. The other theory is that sun spots have a like effect and there is an absence of sun spots now, the climate is mild. Weather forecasters, however, do not use either theory as a basis of making predictions. They are waiting for the proof.

DENIES ANY CONNECTION WITH THE CRIME

Rev. Fr. Delorme Disposes of Rumor That he Was Concerned.

MONTREAL, Jan. 18.—Interviewed here tonight by a representative of the Montreal Gazette in connection with the murder of Raoul Delorme, 24 year old Ottawa College student whose body with six bullet wounds in the head was found in a snick in the north end of this city on January 7th last. Rev. Father Adelard Delorme, half brother of the murdered man, issued the following statement: "Yes, I have heard the rumors and I am very sorry that these rumors could have mentioned my name. It is a hard enough blow to any man to lose his brother under such circumstances without the suspicion of being connected with the affair. The connection that rumor gives me in the affair is based upon the fact that my brother was insured a week before the murder. Now, it is reasonable that I would kill him for that small sum when I have plenty for myself? If I were inclined to commit a crime of that nature I could have waited until next summer when we intended to go to New Orleans. "On the night of the murder I went out for a short time to call on a certain person. The detectives verified that. During the remainder of the night my sisters were in the house and can prove that I was in the house from 11:20 at night until the next morning until the detectives came to ask me to go to the morgue to identify my brother's body. I am sorry that the rumors have got things so tangled up and I hope that a stop will be put to them." Father Delorme added that though not connected with any church, he was a priest in 1909 standing and chaplain to L'Assistance Publique. "I visit the aged and sick. I administer the sacraments and the last rites of the church to the sick and dying. I say my mass at St. James' church and frequently at there." The second sitting of the inquest will be held tomorrow and will probably then be adjourned for another week to gather further information.
