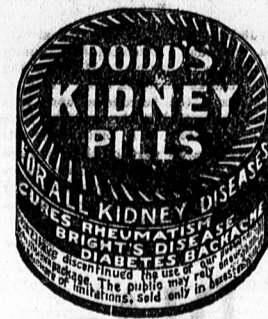


A WINNING CARD.
