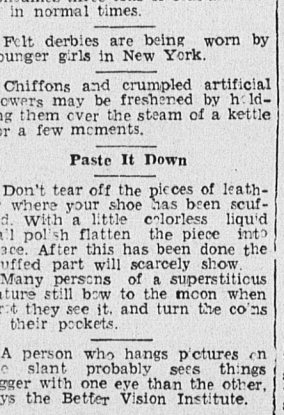

WIFE NEEDS TO HAVE OTHER THAN JUST HOME INTERESTS She Endangers Her Place In Her Husband's Affections If She Cannot Talk About General Subjects

Heaven alone knows how the theory ever originated that the proper thing for a woman to do was to emulate the lowly turtle and carry her house on her back, nevertheless this is the commonly accepted ideal of the perfect wife. Most people consider that the highest compliment they can pay a married woman is to say that she is home-keeping and, if they want to put a little more grease in their soft soap they add that she never goes anywhere except to church and the market. Men are especially committed to the traditional belief that there is some particular virtue in a woman staying put within the four walls of her house, though, if they considered the subject, they must know that a wife who has virtually no contact with the outside world, and whose most exciting topic of conversation is the rise in the price of butchers' meat and the baby dull tireside companion. More than that what having said ga-ga, is bound to make a mighty virtually sane woman, and a cell gets on the sloutest woman's nerves and makes her peevish and fretful and nagging. ANSWER—There is no cut-and-dried answer to this question. Undoubtedly there are some women, as there are some men, who are so wedded to their careers that they put them before all human relationships, and let their ambition crowd out all thoughts of love.

But the majority of women who follow careers want love and marriage and children, as well as success in the outside world, and the tragedy is that when they try to gra p both they are almost bound to lose one, and only too often lose both. Most career women are divorced once or twice or oftener.

If a woman gives up her career for marriage she is almost sure to

regret it and to pine for the excitement, the thrills, the adventure she has known and to long for the money she has made. Honeymoons seem dim when contrasted with the footlight, and the clasp of a baby's arms around her neck do not compensate her for the glare of the limelight.

On the contrary, if she gives up love for her career, then she is certain to know heart-hunger and loneliness and, as a poet once put it, "How desolate it is to sit by a solitary fire and hear the nations praising one afar."

One of the cruel injustices of life is that a talented man who remains in a wife and home and children to his career and be the more successful for doing so, but when a talented woman tries to add husband and home and children to her career it is virtually always her undoing. Because, for one thing, husbands are almost universally jealous of a wife's success outside of the home, and because no woman can be in two places at the same time and be a homemaker and yet away acting, or lecturing, or doctoring, or gone on some business venture.

THE COOK'S CORNER

BACON MUFFINS

2 cups sifted flour
3 1-2 teaspoons baking powder
1-2 teaspoon salt
1-2 table-spoons sugar
1-2 cup diced cooked bacon
1 egg
7-8 cup milk
2 table-spoons melted fat

Method: Fry bacon strips until very crisp and then break or cut into small pieces. Sift the flour, then measure it and sift again with the baking powder salt and sugar. Add the bacon and mix well. Beat the egg and measure the milk and add to it. You measure 7-8 cup milk by first filling a measuring cup and then removing 2 table-spoons. Add the liquid mixture to the dry mixture and stir until well-blended, then add the melted fat and mix slightly. Fill greased muffin pans 2-3 full and bake in a moderately hot oven (425 deg. F.) for about 20 to 25 minutes.

HONEY BRAN MUFFIN

1-4 cup fat
1-2 cup honey
1 egg
1 cup milk
1 cup sifted flour
3 table-spoons baking powder
1-2 teaspoon salt
2 cups all bran

Method: Cream the fat (use butter or shortening) with the honey until smooth. Beat the egg thoroughly and then beat into the creamed mixture. Sift the flour, measure, and sift again with the baking powder, and the salt, then add the all bran, and mix thoroughly. Add the dry ingredients to the creamed mixture, alternately with the milk, mixing after each addition until smooth. Fill greased muffin pan 2-3 full with the mixture and bake in a moderately hot oven (425 deg. F.) for about 25 minutes.

SPANISH RICE

3-4 cup rice
2 table-spoons fat
5 cups boiling water
2 onions, chopped
2 cups tomatoes
3 table-spoons chopped stuffed olives
Salt and pepper
Paprika

Method: Pick over, wash, and drain the rice. Fry the rice in the fat until brown, then add the water and let it boil for 15 minutes until the rice is cooked tender.

Melt some additional fat in a pan and cook the chopped onions in this until delicately brown. Mix the oil with the tomatoes and chopped olives, then combine with the cooked rice. Add the seasonings, and place in a greased casserole. Bake in a moderate oven (350 deg. F.) for about 30 minutes.

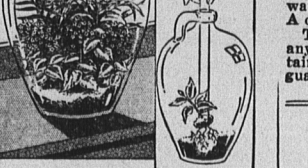
