STOCK QUOTATIONS

Morning Stock Letter

(Received by Pitfield & Co's Special Wire)

NEW YORK, Sept. 30—The French Senate is debating the Devaluation Bill and approval is expected. The French bourse will probably not open until Thursday. Stocks again in American issues are strong and the American issues active and steady. Domestic news continues favorable. Iron Age writes optimistically concerning the steel industry. Gasoline stocks were down last week 814,000 barrels and crude oil production was down 6900 barrels. Electric Power output was also favorable. Twentieth Century Fox declared an initial dividend of \$1 on the common. American stocks in London are either a fraction above or a fraction below last week's closing. We would look for an irregular firm market in New York today. The Power conference is scheduled to take place in Washington and will probably help the utility group.

TORONTO, Sept. 30—Big Missouri—Vancouver says—Recent extension of option on balance of treasury shares indicates that Big Missouri hopes to raise sufficient funds by this means to maintain its 40 percent equity in the Buena Vista Mine which ownership of the Big Missouri Mines is vested. Work at the property is now concentrated on preparations for mill.

Hallwell—High grade material at Hallwell has intersected good mineral conditions in diamond drilling and officials state that results justify shaft sinking and underground development.

BRALORNE—September production is expected to be about the same or better than August when a new high record was established at \$209,000.

LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Sept. 30—Trading was light on Montreal Livestock markets today in early dealings with no sales on the cattle section. Receipts cattle 75; calves 244; hogs 256; sheep 18.

Veal calves were steady at \$6 to \$8 for fair to good quality. Common drinkers traded at \$4 and slightly higher while an odd sale was made of heavy western calves at \$3.75 to \$4. Grassers ranged from \$2 ewes and wethers were \$7.25, buck lambs \$6.25 and culs \$5.25. Sheep were unchanged at \$2 to \$4.

Bacon hogs fed and watered were \$8.50 with selects drawing a \$1 premium. Butcher and heavies were \$8 and extra heavies \$7.50. Sows remained firm at \$6 to \$7.

Hog prices were 15 cents lower on rail grade and 10 cents lower on live grade. Rail grade traded at \$11.15 and live grade \$8.50 weighed off cars. Sows were sold for \$8 rail grade and \$6 weighed off cars.

Steers sold from \$6 down and cows from \$3.25 down. Canners were \$1 to \$1.50 and cutters \$1.50 to \$2.25. Top for bulls was \$3. Grass calves sold up to \$3.50 and veal \$7 while lambs were also at \$7.

MINING

TORONTO, Sept. 30—After stepping out boldly in early trading, the mining list of Toronto Exchange developed irregularly later on selective buying and selling. At the close golds were off about a half-point to 138.44 and other groups were up less than a half-point in the index. Volume at 797,000 shares was the smallest for a full session since April 28.

The big golds continued to play a minor role, trading lightly at steady prices. Wright Hargreaves and Teck Hughes showed considerable volume with Hargreaves down 5 cents to 7.75 and Teck up 10 to 5.85. Toburn stood out with a gain of 45 cents to 3.90 in trade of about 10,000 shares. Hard Rock touched 2.90 before the advance was checked by profit-taking. The close was 25 cents up at 2.80.

Other golds to move up smartly on good volume were Premier, Chibougamau, Francoeur and O'Brien but the last two dropped their gains before the close.

PRODUCE

MONTREAL, Sept. 30—Eggs prices displayed firm trends on Montreal open produce markets day while other lines ruled quiet and steady.

Butter was sold at 24 1-4 cents per pound for cartons or less of no. 1 while lots to retailers were 25 1-2 for solids and 26 for prints.

Graded egg shipments in cartons or less were quoted at 33 cents a dozen for a-large, 31 for a-medium and 25 for A-pullets, 23 1-2 for B and 20 1-2 for C.

Cheese averaged 13 15 16 cents per pound for Quebec and 14 1-4-3-4 for Ontario.

GRAIN

CHICAGO, Sept. 30—Owing largely to a month-end tumble of corn prices, weakness developed in all grain today toward the last. Despite transient rallies that in some cases lifted wheat a cent a bushel the wheat market afterwards reacted with corn. Shrinkage of demand for cash delivery of corn was a late bearish factor.

Corn closed unsteady down 7-8 1-2 Dec 93 3-4 7-8, May 89 89 1-8 1-8, unchanged to 5-8 off, Dec. 112 7-8 113, May 111 3-8 1-2, oats 3-8 3-4 down, and provisions varying from 5 cents decline to 25 cents advance.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 30—Wide and frequent price fluctuations were the rule on Winnipeg Grain Exchange today, wheat futures closing with net recessions of 5-8 1-4 cents despite 500,000 bushel export sales.

Irregularity prevailed throughout the session, though trading volume was not large. October closed at \$1.06 7-8 November \$1.07, December \$1.05 1-8 and May \$1.06 3-4.

Weakness in outside markets prompted selling that found the pit bare of support, with most of the offering credited to Chicago interests. Cheaper Australian offers on new-crop wheat at Liverpool was a bearish factor.

Liverpool was off 1 3-4D to lead a general downward trend in world wheat prices. Chicago dipped fractionally and Buenos Aires was down a cent. Coarse grains prices followed wheat to lower levels, but cash-grains spreads held quietly firm.

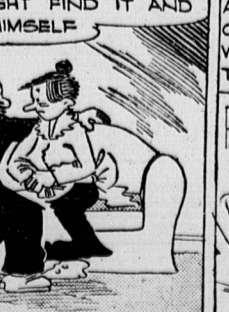
