CANADIANS IN HOSPITALS OF UNITED KINGDOM

(Canadian Press Despatch) OTTAWA.—The latest return of Canadian patients in hospitals in the United Kingdom, received in Ottawa today, gives a total of 19,459 on April 20, including 533 officers. The total has fallen from its highest level, 20,256 on October 20, 1916, to 14,165 on April 6. The total for April 20 is made up thus: In Canadian primary hospitals 3,180 In Canadian special hospitals 1,658 There are 631 patients in the

In Canadian convalescent hospitals 3,986 In special sanatoria 82 In special hospitals 10,553 The latest return of men on the strength of the military hospitals commission command in Canada showed a total of 5,952 on April 30. The total on April 15 was 5,677, having risen to that point from 2,404 at Christmas. The latest total is made up of 3,662 inpatients and 2,290 outpatients. In all, there are 1,130 men who have not been overseas. At the convalescent homes on April 30 there were 2,220 overseas and 281 camp men; while the convalescent outpatients numbered 1,934 overseas and 447 camp men. There are 631 patients in the

sanatoria for tuberculosis with eight outpatients, 414 of the total being overseas men, and the remaining 225 camp men. The total of 5,952 is completed by 331 men in other institutions. THE DEPLETED PRUSSIAN ARMIES FRENCH ARMY HEADQUARTERS—Indications show that the strength of the German forces totalled on the first of April 219 divisions, each comprising a maximum of from ten to twelve thousand combatants. Of these divisions 143 faced the French and

British, but only 99 were in the actual line, the others being held in strategic reserve. The remaining 76 divisions were then on the Russian, Rumanian and Macedonian fronts. Many of the strategic reserve divisions have since been thrown into line, and owing to losses, were later sent to the rear for reconstruction. Reckoning 12,000 men to their depleted divisions, the above forces would be distributed as follows: On Fighting Line Reserve Total Western 1,188,000 528,000 1,716,000 Front Eastern 912,000 Fronts Total 2,628,000

DISTILLERIES MAKING EXPLOSIVES FOR BRITISH

(Canadian Press Despatch) OTTAWA.—A useful debate was precipitated in the commons today by E. B. Devlin, of Wright county, upon the subject of grain for breweries and distilleries. There is a general impression that the immense quantities of grain which were formerly used for the production of whiskey and beer are still to almost the same extent being gobbled up by these institutions for the self-same purpose. The impression is wrong. Only a very few, and these the very smallest of the distilleries, are engaged in the manufacture of liquor.

Instead they are producing high explosives for the imperial munitions board in immense quantities, and when the story of the war is able to be written the part the distilleries have played in the production of munitions will be one of the most noteworthy chapters.

Very few members of parliament even were aware of this until today, when the debate on Mr. Devlin's motion brought out some of the particulars.

However the breweries are still manufacturing beer, and altho not in such large quantities as formerly, the amount of grain used for the production of this beverage is a serious consideration in view of the food situation.

Mr. Devlin moved that in view of the necessity of conserving the food supply for the use of Canada and the Allies, and in view of the cost of living, the supply of grain to distilleries and breweries should be prohibited.

Sir George Foster, on behalf of the government, pointed out that the resolution could not be accepted in this form, but he admitted that the question of grain for bread instead of liquor was at present before the government. However, he could not tell what the outcome would be. In view of this, Mr. Devlin withdrew his motion.
