**WOMAN SUFFRAGE.**

It may be remembered that Sir John Macdonald once promised to give the women of Canada the right to vote for members of the House of Commons, but afterwards withdrew the clause from the franchise bill under pressure from both sides of the House. Probably this was the best thing to do as neither then nor since that time have the majority of Canadian women given any indication that they desire to vote in parliamentary elections. There are a number who would like to vote, but we believe they are still a minority. When the majority become desirous of the voting franchise they will no doubt find their desires conceded. The enfranchisement of women is, however, steadily making progress in the world.

In New Zealand women were years ago placed on the same footing as men in regard to voting for all elective representatives or officials. The Commonwealth of Australia has more recently brought in women suffrage. In the States of Colorado, Idaho, Utah and Wyoming women have full suffrage and vote for all elective officers, including presidential electors. In Kansas women exercise the suffrage largely in municipal elections. In some form, mainly as to taxation, or the election of school boards, women may vote in half the States of the American union, in Great Britain, in many European countries and in parts of India and Canada. Denmark is now leading the way among European countries in preparing for the full enfranchisement of women.

The Minister of the Interior has intro-

duced into the Folketing, or Lower House of the national Parliament, a bill which, if adopted, will extend the privilege of voting to every citizen twenty-five years of age who has paid taxes for the year preceding, and who has a fixed home, steady farm hands, domestic servants and others who have no fixed homesteads are excepted, as are also those in bankruptcy. The great feature of the bill is that it provides that every one who is entitled to vote is also eligible to hold office. As the bill makes no exception as regards sex, the women of Denmark will have every elective office from premier down open to them under its operation. Opposition to it has been manifested among the Conservatives in the Upper House, but it is said to be popular with the people.

**ELECTRIC RAILWAYS.**

Prince Edward Island is the one Province of the Dominion which has not a single mile of electric railway within its boundaries. This is not a pleasant thing to contemplate in view of the great progress made in the construction and operation of electric railways in all civilized countries. The Electrical World tells that there are enough electric railways now in operation if placed end to end to belt the earth at the equator. There are 27 cars per mile, so that if they were evenly distributed there would be nearly one seventh part of the line covered with cars with spaces of only 170 feet between cars.

Each car carries daily an average of 220 passengers, or 80,500 fares a year. Each mile of the electric roads earns on an average \$11,000. So that the earnings of all would be sufficient to belt the earth with dollar notes and six thousand miles over. The cost of operating the roads averaged fifty-seven per cent of the receipts, and the number of employees is about six per mile exclusive of the salaried officers of the companies.

A handsomely illustrated guide to Bridport, England, has come to hand. Bridport is a pretty town of some 6,000 inhabitants and with many interesting historic associations dating back to the days of Prince Charles, the civil war of Cromwell's time, the Invincible Armada and the wars of Saxons and Danes. Here is a public monument to Hardy, one of Nelson's famous captains. The staple trade of Bridport is the manufacture of cordage, twine and nets, a portion of which is supplied to Prince Edward Island.
