A. was particularly smart and active, and a good skater; B. did good work on the right wing; G. at cover lifted in fine style, and checked well while J. is a very clever rover. McNeill who was in goal last year, is now one of the best of the forwards; Byers at point is a big fellow, a cousin of George Byers, the pugilist, and Crosby made some great stops in goal, and but for him there would have been a larger score.
