Lyons Pleads For Confidence In Australia

Hon. Joseph Aloysius Lyons, a hard-working member of the Labor cabinet of Prime Minister James H. Scullin, finally revolted against what he thought was "trucking to the extremists," left the Cabinet in December 1930 and threw himself into the fray as leader of a great campaign for a non-party body, pledged to the restoration of financial and economic stability in Australia. Such are his personal qualifications that he became in a few months the logical man to form a government, probably a coalition government of the Nationalist and Country parties with the aid of right-wing members of the Labor Government's defeat in the Labor Government's defeat in the general election that appeared inevitable.

Hon. Mr. Lyons, who was born Sept. 15, 1879, entered the Commonwealth arena in 1920, after a brilliant political career in the state of Tasmania. He had been treasurer, minister of education and of railways in the Tasmanian government from 1914 to 1916. He was premier and treasurer of the state from 1923 until 1928.

In 1929 Mr. Lyons was elected to the Commonwealth house of representatives for Wilmut, and entered the cabinet of Prime Minister James Scullin as post-master-general and minister for works and railways, after the defeat of the Bruce administration in October, 1929. He became acting treasurer as well, when Hon. E. G. Theodore resigned the treasurer-ship in the following summer.

In the autumn and early winter months of 1930 when Prime Minister Scullin was absent at the Imperial Conference, Mr. Lyons fought a hard and gallant battle against the extremists within the Labor Party. His differences with them widened to an open breach in November, when he was unable to prevent the majority carrying a resolution that holders of maturing bonds to the extent of \$140,000,000 should be asked to wait another year for payment.

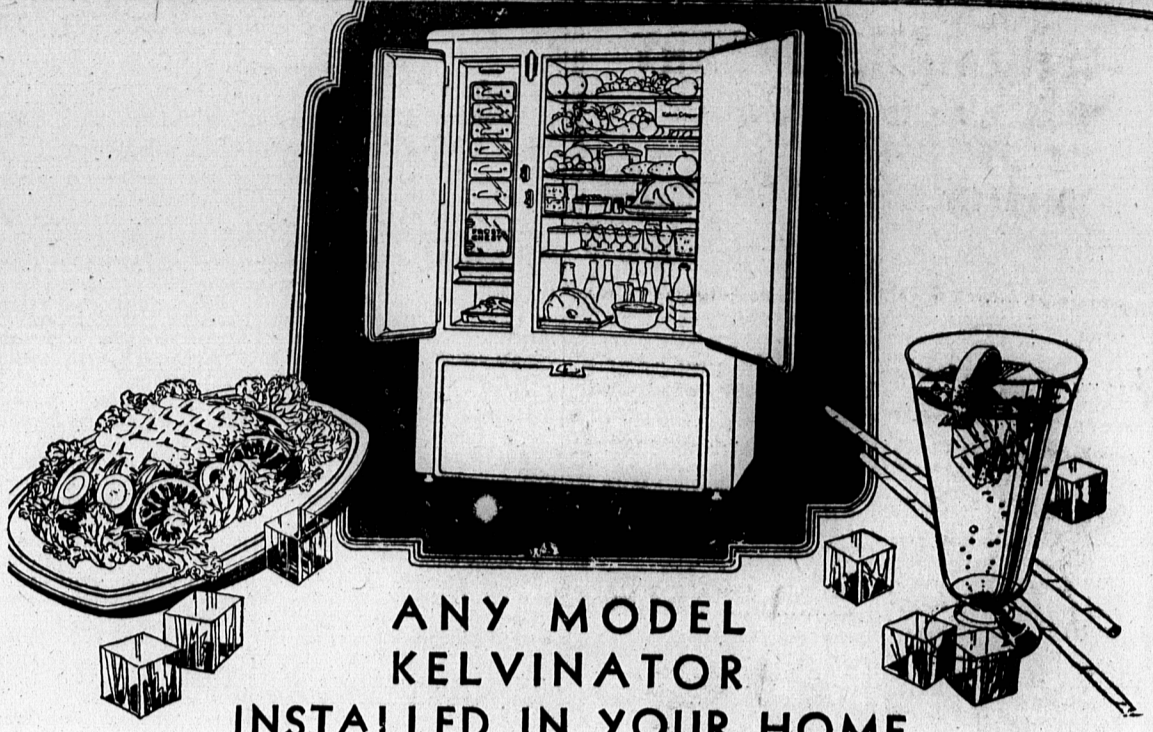
But, backed by Premier Scullin and Hon. James Fenton, minister of trade Mr. Lyons successfully blocked this first step towards repudiation by the Commonwealth of Australia. He instituted a vigorous campaign on behalf of a conversion loan. The loan was oversubscribed by the Australians before the previous obligations matured in December and the result constituted a great personal triumph for Mr. Lyons.

The re-entry of Mr. Theodore to the cabinet was strongly opposed by Mr. Lyons and eventually, with Hon. Mr. Fenton, he resigned. Outside the party, he became an increasingly active and strong opponent of the Labor extremists, and when Hon. J. T. Lang, radical head of the New South Wales government, carried out his threat to default payments of interest to London bondholders on April 1 last, Mr. Lyons commenced his biggest campaign. He declared he would organize a great national party pledged to the restoration of economic and financial balance.

The campaign proved an immediate success for Mr. Lyons. Crowds gave him a great ovation when he made his first speech at Adelaide, South Australia, April 9. He set out as his platform the balancing of the budget and the restoration of "sound and sane" government. He proposed the appointment of an expert, non-political committee to investigate and determine the periods over which the budget could be balanced, for it was apparent that neither the current budget nor the next could be balanced.

Mr. Lyons stressed that only a restoration of confidence in Australian would enable her to reduce the heavy load of interest payments, for only by the squashing of the talk of repudiation, the abandoning of attempts to interfere with the currency or with the administration of the banks, would give any prospect of successful conversion operations to lower interest rates. He especially attacked the proposal for a fiduciary issue of \$90,000,000. At Melbourne a few days later he had another success—in a city that had consistently snubbed the extreme leader, Premier Lang, by refusing him permission to use public buildings for a projected meeting.

SOUR CREAM FUDGE

3 cups granulated sugar.
2 1/4 squares bitter chocolate.
1 cup sour cream.
1 teaspoon vanilla.
1/2 teaspoon salt.
Nutmegs.

Melt chocolate in saucepan over hot water; add sugar and sour cream; continue stirring over low flame until every grain of sugar is dissolved, then increase heat. Wash down any grains from side of pan or spoon and stir until boiling point is reached. Boil without stirring to 238 degrees F. or until a very soft ball forms when dropped in cold water.

Spread on a slightly oiled platter or porcelain-topped table and allow to cool to 110 degrees—not much warmer than the fingers. Work with a spatula until creamy. Add vanilla and salt; knead with the hands until candy is smooth. Roll into balls about one-inch in diameter and then roll in chopped nutmeats.
