## HOME NEXT FALL

The following letter was received  
from Pte. L. M. Robertson, of the  
12th Canadian Mounted Rifles, Bram-  
shot, by his parents, Mr. and Mrs.  
Allan Robertson, Mt. Hope:  
We are still at Bramshot Camp,  
but expect to be moved to a cavalry  
camp soon. The 9th C. M. R. is here  
now; the 8th, 9th and 12th make a  
brigade. We will all be sent to the  
front together. The South African  
troops are starting to-morrow for the  
Dardanelles; they have been in camp  
fourteen months, eight miles South  
of us.  
You asked if I get lots of clothes  
from the Government. We just apply  
for them at the regimental stores  
and they chuck us out anything we  
ask for.  
I expect to be back next fall. The  
British are preparing to equip an  
army of 4,000,000 men; also to sup-  
ply equipment for 6,000,000 Rus-  
sians to go into the field in early  
spring. At present the recruiting  
offices all over Great Britain are  
crowded with men eager to enlist.  
England is sure a pretty country  
with towns dotted all over. We are  
within three miles of five of them.
