At such a time too we may fittingly recall the Laureate's prayer, given to the world while Queen Victoria still lived:

May you rule us long,
And leave us rulers of your blood
As noble till the latest day!
We have today a ruler of her blood as noble, and by his side a Queen who is the idol of the British people. He has also set to all his myriad subjects an example of filial reverence and affection in retaining the place of honor for his mother's birthday rather than his own. There is an exalted lesson in this, and it serves to increase the love and devotion of all right-thinking persons toward our good King.

THE FATE OF DALNY.

Dalny, situated 15 miles N. E. of Port Arthur, has been called the Flat City because it was created by order of the Czar. By his order it has recently been destroyed. Only five years ago the edict for its construction was issued, and in two years plans were prepared and with the labor of twenty-five thousand men there was completed a beautiful modern town where before had stood only a few native huts. It had practically no inhabitants until it was finished. At the commencement of the war Dalny had 40,000 inhabitants of whom 30,000 were Chinese and the Russians, or persons of other nationalities. We have thus to think of a city as large as Halifax or St. John planned as a whole by the architects and completed in two years, with streets, splendid public buildings, dwellings, shops, factories, with water supply, sewerage and lighting systems, and with its splendid harbor equipped with breakwater, five large piers and docks extending for two miles along the shore.

There were two first-class dry docks, one intended for ordinary steamers and the other designed to accommodate the largest vessels of war or commerce. There were also large new shops for the construction and repair of steamships, and for the building and repair of railway cars. Dalny was designed as the commercial terminus as Port Arthur was the naval and military terminus of the great Russian trans-Asiatic railway system. It is estimated that \$35,000,000 had been expended by the Russian Government at Dalny before the war commenced. The port with its costly docks, construction shops and all that could serve Japanese purposes have now being destroyed. The Chinese population had been first ordered away, so that the splendid city which came into being as if by magic is now little more than a desolate ruin. It was destroyed owing to the certainty that it must fall into Japanese hands and if left intact would have aided them in their attack upon Port Arthur. Such is part of the price which Russia pays for being unable to defend the Flat City.
