SYDNEY is importing about all its meat from Ontario and P. E. Island. During the hot season live stock in large numbers were taken from P. E. Island and rother Cape Breton. With the exception of what came from Inverness county, the latter was generally poor. The meats from Ontario reach Sydney in far better condition than that which is taken from P. E. Island. The latter is subject to so much shifting from car to boat, and vice-versa, that the tallow is broken, and the meat much abused before it is placed on sale. It comes via Charlottetown and Pictou. The Island beef, however is better flavored than the Ontario but the latter sells for about 10c less, and consequently is in better demand. It is besides, in better condition than the other. Mutton and lamb from P. E. Island commands about 10c more than that imported from Ontario. The wholesale prices are now: Beef 6c; mutton 6c; lamb 7c; pork 7c; geese, 10c; fowl 9c and 10c. The market is very good; there has been no drop in prices this season.—Maritime Merchant.
