NOSES WILL BE COUNTED IN FAR NORTH

CHURCHILL, Man., May 13—Government officials and others who, in the course of their regular activities, travel by boat, dogged and arduous into the far north reaches of the Canadian Arctic will act as census enumerators this year and collect vital statistics of the native and white population without extra cost to the government, Canadian National Railways officials at this far north port on Hudson Bay have been advised from Ottawa. To count the Eskimos, they will have to visit sealing and whaling camps far out on the Arctic ice pack, trapping and fishing areas, reindeer stations as well as trading and missionary posts.

PICTOU LODGE OPENS JUNE 28

PICTOU, N. S., May 13—Among many attractions at Pictou Lodge near here, operated by the Canadian National Railways, which opens for the season on June 28th, is that guest cabins front on a fresh water lagoon while but a few steps away the administration building faces the salt water of Northumberland Strait which maintains an ideal temperature for bathing throughout the season. Pictou, possessing the world's largest good harbour for deep sea craft, was founded in June 1767 by six families from Pennsylvania and Maryland sent by the Philadelphia Company. It was from Pictou in 1833 that the "Royal William," the first vessel to cross the Atlantic by steam power, sailed on her voyage to Gravesend, England.
