R. on corn and cornmeal was the chief matter before the board. W. S. Tilton, representing the Montreal Board of Trade, presented the case for the manufacturers in Upper Canada who wanted the present rate from Montreal to points in the Maritime Provinces reduced from 17 1/2 to 15 cents. The local cornmeal manufacturers asked that the shippers in St. John be given the same rate. ANOTHER AIRMAN GONE

CHALONS SUR MARNE, France, July 9—Rene Bedel, one of the most experienced airmen and the holder of the Pommeroy Cup for cross-country flying, which he won from Jules Vedrines, met his death this morning before the eyes of thousands of French troops, who were assembled on the reviewing grounds at Mourmelon-Le-Grand, near here. Bedel, who had come in his monoplane from Valloicublay, near Paris, to participate in the maneuvers, arrived above the camp after a fine flight. He was about to descend when his monoplane struck the telegraph wires, which the prevailing haze evidently prevented him from seeing. His machine capsized and Bedel was thrown to the ground. It is believed that he was not killed by the fall, but the motor of his aeroplane fell on his body and he was crushed almost beyond recognition.

NEW YORK, July 9—A cable despatch to the New York Times from Paris this morning says:—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Echo de Paris reports that Prince Arthur of Connaught, only son of the Duke of Connaught, will shortly marry Princess Irene Alexandrovna, daughter of the Grand Duke Alexander Michailovitch, who is a cousin of the Czar. It is stated that the marriage was decided upon last August, but that no official announcement was made, owing to the youth of the princess, who, however, is now just about to reach her seventeenth birthday, when the betrothal will be announced. The marriage, it is added, will be celebrated in St. Petersburg, and it is expected that King George will attend the ceremony.

MR. BORDEN SEES FLEET MANEUVERS.

LONDON, July 9—The active British fleet in English waters and the vessels from the Mediterranean station, consisting of some 315 ships of all classes, gathered at Spithead today for inspection by the members of the house of lords, and commons. Rt-Hon. Robert L. Borden, the Canadian Premier, with his colleagues, J. D. Hazen, minister of marine; C. J. Doherty, minister of justice; and L. P. Pelletier, postmaster-general, who are now in England to consult the British admiralty on Canada's naval program, attended the inspection which opened with a display of aeroplanes and hydroplanes now being used for the first time in British naval maneuvers. The greater fleet later proceeded to sea for the summer maneuvers. This is one of the strongest fleets, if not the strongest that has ever assembled and still many effective vessels remain in the naval ports, including those of the eighth battle squadron and the seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, and eleventh cruiser squadrons, as well as a number of ships under repair. The visitation to the lords and commonsers is a new way First Lord of the Admiralty Winston Churchill has of impressing the men who have to vote the money with the needs of a great navy. The legislators were going on steamers, which cruised thru the lines of ships, around the latest battleships and past the submarines and other vessels of the mosquito fleet. The maneuvers are to be held in the North Sea and altho the plans of the admiralty have been kept secret, that the problem set for elucidation enough has leaked out to indicate is concerned with the frustration of an attempted raid by a force of troops under naval convoy. The ships are to be divided into two fleets, red and blue, the latter constituting the defending forces under Prince Louis of Battenburg, and the former the attacking forces under the command of Sir George Callaghan. Twenty-one admirals will have their flags flying in addition to two commodores. The attacking force will probably consist of twenty battleships, of which eight will be dreadnoughts, ten armoured cruisers, including one dreadnought cruiser, seven protected cruisers and the auxiliary fleet, while the defence includes 23 battleships of which five will be dreadnoughts, four battleship cruisers and 16 other armoured cruisers, four protected cruisers, a great fleet of submarines, destroyers, torpedo boats and mine layers.
