SIR HENRY'S RESIDENCE

OTTAWA, May 11.—(By The Canadian Press)—During the period between the resolution of the Canadian National Railways directors, in September 1929, in which they approved the leasing of an official residence for the President, Sir Henry Thornton, and the actual provision of that residence in August 1930, Sir Henry was allowed compensation in lieu of rent, according to evidence given before the House of Commons committee on railways and shipping today.

The matter was brought up by F. R. MacMillan, (Cons., Saskatoon). He read from the board's resolution and asked Sir Henry if "the President received money in lieu of rent from September 27, 1929, up to the time the house was leased by the railways."

"It was the board's intention that the provision of the house should date from the day on which the resolution was approved," Sir Henry replied, "and that I should be compensated for whatever rental I had paid in the meantime."

Reading the terms of that resolution Mr. MacMillan quoted that the directors in September 1929, authorized the leasing of a suitable residence under terms which the committee might deem proper. There was nothing in the resolution that permitted the executive committee of the board to make a retroactive bonus from that month, Mr. MacMillan said.

"I had nothing to do with that," replied Sir Henry. He had left the matter in the hands of the board that was all he knew about it.

"That means you got an extra \$36,000," suggested Mr. MacMillan. "I don't recall the amount," Sir Henry replied. He would get the information.

Some protest from members of the committee elicited from Mr. MacMillan the observation that the people had not sent him to Ottawa to authorize "hidden emoluments."

Miners Will Again Vote On Wage Cut

GLACE BAY, N. S., May 11 (By the Canadian Press)—Nine workers employed in the collieries of the Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation, will once more be given an opportunity of voting on the wage reductions proposed by the company, it was announced at the conclusion of a meeting of the executive officers of the United Mine Workers, District 26, tonight. The date of the second referendum has not been announced.

Rum Runners Get Maximum

(Canadian Press) BRIDGEPORT, Conn., May 11.—Captain Joseph Yorke, of Portland, Maine, Master of the Lighter, William H. Moody, which was seized at Stamford, March 25, with a \$250,000 liquor cargo, was fined \$2,000 and sentenced to one year in jail today. Judge John Rufus Booth in Superior Court imposed the maximum penalty. He also fined Charles Foss of South Portland, Maine, engineer on boat, \$1,000, with a six months jail term.

The men pleaded nolo contendere and threw themselves on the mercy of the court. Other cases are pending.

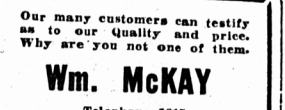

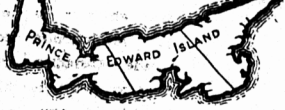
