**NEW ARGYLE SCHOOL.**—The semi-annual examination of New Argyle School, No. 56, was held Monday, June 30th, there being present eighteen ratepayers and visitors. The teacher then dismissed her pupils for their midsummer vacation.

**EXAMINATIONS.**—The examination of Albany Plains and Vernon River Schools took place on the forenoon of Monday, June 30th. The half-yearly examination was held in the school-house at Albany Plains. There are thirty-two pupils enrolled and twenty-eight were present. The pupils were examined on their subjects of instruction by their teacher and by the teacher of Vernon River School.
