that the "person who made the overtures to me presented to me a letter addressed to him and signed by Premier Meighen." And in this, in a later despatch from Ottawa, Premier Meighen has promptly called his bluff, with further disclaimer, and adding that "IF THE LATTER (Mr. Veniot) HAD ANY EVIDENCE TO THE CONTRARY, LET HIM PRODUCE IT LIKE A MAN." It will be a safe wager that the Hon. Peter will now sit down. It is a case of put up or shut up, and not having the goods to put up he will only have to swallow his medicine and put up with the humiliation.


But what of Hon. Mr. Crerar, who grasped at this scandalous story to use it against a former Cabinet colleague and a present political opponent? His apology is not yet reported in the press. Those of us who remember the high ideals upon which this farmers movement started are rather taken by surprise at this.

Our first impression of this organization was as that of a party of white winged purity in which, and from which, all those degrading corruptions of party politics were to be eliminated, and the national issues were to be contested

along the lines of fair play and upon the merits of the platforms and the public questions which were to be left to the decision of the people unhampered by corrupt prejudices. In the joining of his hands with Liberalism becoming a party to their policy changes and contemptible campaign methods, if he has not soiled the wings and tarnished the white and angelic robes of his party of purity, by this companionship and scandal-mongering he certainly has not added lustre to those characteristics of the farmers of Canada who as a class are too clean and too honorable to ve under the leadership of any man who would seek to produce their advancement by any methods of this kind.

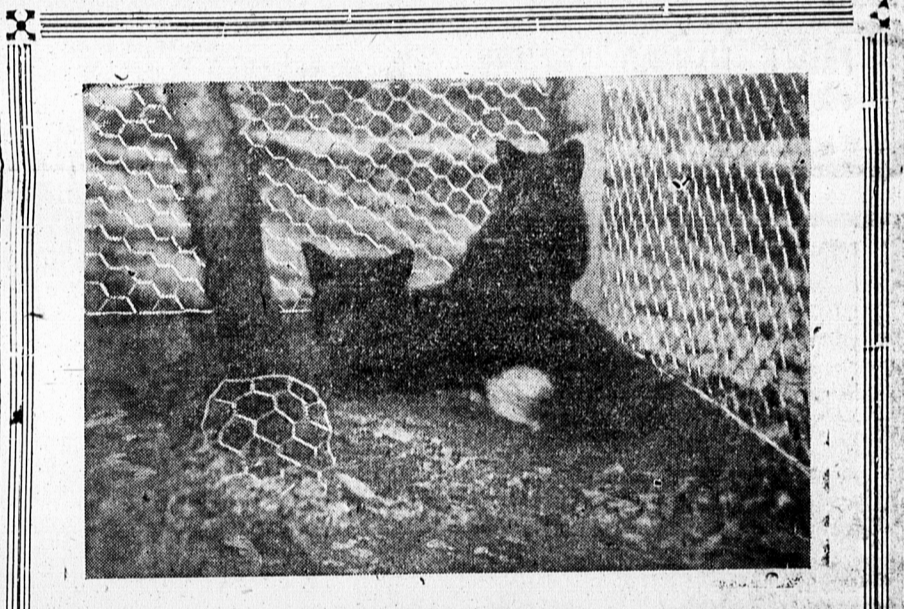
