The Unionists are willing that their
brethren who favored a Union
Church should go, and take all their
property with them—churches,
manses, most of the colleges, and
their share of all funds, and depart
peaceably; but leave to their
churches, manses, glebes and their
places of the funds. To
just proportion of the funds. To
this the Unionists will not agree,
but propose to take the whole prop-
erty of the Presbyterian church.
But as the law now stands they
find that they cannot take all that
they would like.

But there is a method by which
they can take all the church prop-
erty. It is this: to get the Dom-
inion Parliament to pass a bill giv-
ing them the right to all the prop-
erty of the Presbyterian Church
in Canada, and then to get all the
provincial parliaments to pass sim-
ilar bills, and all the property will
be theirs. Let the Unionists re-
member that "the Lord hates rob-
bery for a burnt offering." We be-
lieve that there is no danger of
any parliament passing a bill so
glaringly unjust, it would scandal-
ize any parliament before the
world to pass such a bill; it would
be legalizing robbery.

Some of the churches and manses
of the anti-Unionists are splen-
did and costly mansions, which
were erected at much cost, and in
some cases self-denial for all who
helped to build them were not rich;
and now they are told that these
places of worship, erected to the
glory of God and His worship, and
the comfort of the worshippers,
will be taken from them unless they
obey the dictates of men whom

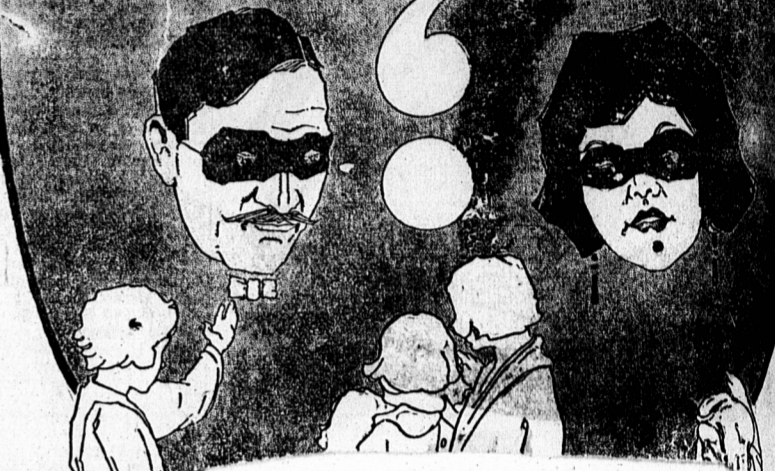
