THE "HOODOO" ENGINE MAKES FAST TIME

She Said to Have Reeled Off Miles in 44 Seconds Recently in a Run from St. John to Montreal.

(Moncton Times.)

Old 230, which has been designated as the "hoodoo engine" on account of the bad accidents in which she was concerned, is reported to have reeled off some very fast miles between Moncton and Newcastle recently. The running ability of No. 230 is well known to engineers, and she has the reputation among some of the railway men at least, of being the best engine on the Intercolonial today. During the winter months, when every other engine on the road was losing time the engine with the bad reputation for accidents, had no difficulty in making running time and doing a little better. Frequently she has been called upon to make up time with the Maritime since being transferred to the northern division, and she has seldom failed to respond to the driver's call. When the special train with the Allan party passed over the road from St. John to Montreal the other day, it was desirable that as a good run as possible, consistent with the spring condition of the roadbed, should be made. No. 230 was consequently taken off her run and put on the Allan special from Moncton to Newcastle. It was on this run that the "hoodoo engine" is said to have established her great record. Some miles, it is reported, were run in 44 seconds. This proved a faster clip than some of the gentlemen cared to travel and old 230 was asked to ease up a bit. The performance, however, was a revelation to some of the railway men aboard and the locomotive was an object of interest when opportunity offered. One gentleman pronounced her the finest locomotive in Canada. Since this notable effort No. 230 has been permitted to return to her staid ways of making running time, and no more, on the Maritime express.

St. John, April 7.—F. O. Chapman, of Toronto is here with a five ton gaso-electro auto-car enroute to England, where he is to spend three years as an official of the Canadian Department of the Interior advertising Canada. Every city, town and hamlet in England and Wales and parts of Scotland and Ireland will be visited. Samples of Canadian farm products will be shown and lectures given by Mr. Chapman. The car is thirty feet long and was specially constructed for the work having room for a large amount of advertising material. His special work is to encourage immigration to this country, particularly to the Canadian Northwest.

Kingston Ont., April 7.—At the medical convocation of Queens University held today in Grant Hall, the Governor-General and Lord Strathcona were present. St. Andrew's Highland Cadets acting as guard of honor. After the laureate of forty medical students, Earl Grey was presented by Principal Gordon for honorary degree of LL. D., Lord Strathcona by Vice-Principal Wilson for the same degree and Rev. Dr. Kirkpatrick, master of Selwyn College, Cambridge, by Prof. Jordan. Earl Grey and Lord Strathcona made brief speeches, and Dr. Kirkpatrick, delivered an address to the students. Chancellor Sir Sanford Fleming presided. After convocation, Lord Grey held a reception in the library of old arts building.

RAILROAD TRAIN STOPPED BY LOCUSTS

Uganda Train Hands Got Out and Shovelled Them from the Rails—Clouded the Heavens.

LONDON, April 9.—The Daily Express published the following:—A remarkable sight was witnessed recently by passengers in one of the down trains on the Uganda Railway, writes an Express correspondent. While passing Nairobi, the headquarters of the railway, a dense swarm of locusts, closely followed by an enormous flock of hawks, circling gracefully round in pursuit of their prey, was seen high up in the heavens. An even stranger sight, and one which told only too plainly of the havoc being wrought in their aerial ranks, was presented by the discarded wings of the locusts which fluttered to the ground like falling leaves.

Not long ago, while proceeding from Lake Victoria to Mombasa, a train ran into a perfect bank of these destructive pests, which continued with more or less density, for a distance of nearly forty miles. In some places they were between four and five inches in depth; but, curiously enough, the entire invasion was confined to a strip of not more than fifty yards on either side of the four-foot way. As soon as the engine struck the swarm the train was brought to a standstill, and for the next two hours a breakdown gang had to be employed in shovelling the locusts from the rails and covering them with sand, the stench being described as almost overpowering.

THE CZAR DESCRIBED AS A MODERN NERO

Spends Hours Card Playing While Empire Totters: Square Mile of the Park of Peterhof to be Encircled With High Spiked Iron Fence.

LONDON, April 5.—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Daily Mail says that preparations are being made for the Czar to remove to Petersburg for the summer. These preparations include the encircling of a square mile of the park with a high spiked iron fence. In the meantime his Majesty will remain at Tsarskoe-Selo, where he never goes outside the inner ring of guards surrounding the palace.

The correspondent quotes an informant at Tsarskoe-Selo to the effect that the Czar is cheerful, and that nobody would suspect from his demeanor the serious condition of the empire. He reads much English political and non-political literature, varying the time with card-playing. The general opinion in St. Petersburg is that the empire is on the verge of revolution.

HOW MEN CHOOSE WIVES

New theories of unconscious selection on the part of man and wife-like mating with like—as opposed to Darwin's theory that men and women depend upon their perceptive an intellectual faculties in choosing each other, were propounded by Prof. Karl Pearson, of University College, London.

He maintained that man has an unconscious tendency to select a wife of his own height, with eyes of his own color, a proportionate span from forehead to forehead, a forehead corresponding to his own, and a constitution of like physical vigor.

These theories he expounded by the use of tables and diagrams.

Among every thousand men the color of the eyes is divided as follows:

Blue.....	363
Green.....	312
Hazel.....	127
Brown.....	94

The eyes of women are generally darker, only 286 of them in every thousand having blue eyes. If these blue-eyed people married at random the result would be that they would mate at the rate of 104 per thousand; but he had discovered that the actual number of marriages per thousand of blue-eyed persons was 140, or 36 above the random average, thus proving that the blue-eyed man and blue-eyed woman are unconsciously attracted towards one another.

In the same way, men with greenish grey or hazel eyes tend to marry women with eyes of like color.

The average height of a man he gave as from 67 to 68 inches, that of a woman as 62 inches, and he contended that the average tall man has a tall wife and the short man a short wife.

"One could hardly imagine a man choosing a wife by measuring her from forehead to forehead," said the professor, yet his diagrams demonstrated that as the span of one increased, so did that of the other. A like result was produced in the measurement of thousands of forearms, his figures showing that there was a distinct tendency on the part of men with long forearms to marry wives with proportionately long forearms.
