THE NAME OF HOE.

Three generations of Samuel Bowles editing a newspaper are duplicated by three generations of R. Hoe making of printing presses, says the Herald. Robert Hoe, who has just died, was one of the most lavish spenders and competent connoisseurs among American collectors of objects of art and rare books; but his title to respect and to fame is the fact that in inheriting wealth power he continued in the third generation the mastery of the printing press, and by his own inventions supplemented those of his grandfather, father and uncles, and aided in perfecting the presses on which a majority of the newspapers of this country and the United Kingdom are printed. For much of the transformation has been wrought in journalism during the past century, that has multiplied vastly the speed, accuracy, and prolificness of the art, the world owes an incalculable debt to Robert Hoe, the English immigrant who arrived in New York city in 1803, and to his partners and to his and their descendants, who have made the business not only profitable but a model in its attitude toward the workmen whom it first trains and then retains in its employ.

GOVERNOR HARMON.

The death of Gov. Johnson leaves Gov. Harmon of Ohio in the centre of the Democratic stage. If he should be re-elected as Governor of Ohio, he will be the logical candidate for the next Democratic presidential nomination. If he should fail of re-election in that public state, it would not destroy his availability. He stands as a staid and conservative Democrat. There is little doubt that he would have the friendship of Bryan in recognition of the absence of Bourbonism in his make-up and his progressive appreciation of the needs of the changing conditions. His record is untarnished, and in view of the opportunity which appears to be shaping for the return of Democracy to a challenging position in the political affairs of the country he is a commanding candidate for national leadership with few rivals.
