SALVADOR ACTION AROUSES NICARAGUE

SAN JUAN DEL SUR, NIARAGUA VIA GALVESTON, TEXAS, Oct. 8, (Special)—Much indignation has been caused in government circles here by the fact that the government of Salvador invited Guatemala, Honduras and Costa Rica to send delegates to Salvador to discuss Nicaraguan affairs.

It is understood the particular thing to be discussed at the convention was the United States ceding to that country an option to construct a canal across the territory of Nicaragua and a naval base on the Pacific coast.

OF SPECIAL INTEREST

PARIS, FRANCE, Oct. 7, (Special)—The National Aerial League has organized two great aeroplane tours. The first will be from Paris to Cairo, Egypt, and the second from Paris to the Persian Gulf.

The estimated three thousand mile trip between Paris and Cairo will be attempted at the end of this month. The route will be by way of Vienna, Belgrade, Constantinople, Koneh, Aleppo, Jerusalem, Port Said and Heliopolis. Elaborate arrangements will be made through the French Foreign Office with the French consuls in the various countries to be passed through to facilitate the tasks of the aviators.

Large supplies of gasoline and lubricating oil were shipped today to Constantinople, whence they will be distributed to the control stations in the Orient, which will be placed about two hundred miles apart.

STOCKHOLM, Oct. 7, (Special)—Crown Prince Gustave Adolph, of Sweden, according to present arrangements, intends to go to the Panama-Pacific Exposition at San Francisco in 1915, and afterward make a tour of the United States.

The Crown Prince was married to Princess Margaret, of Connaught, in 1905.

The Crown Prince will assume the duties of Regent during the illness of his father, King Gustave, who is suffering from the after effects of an operation for appendicitis.

The arrangements for the Crown Prince's trip to London to attend the wedding of Prince Arthur of Connaught to Princess Alexandra of Fife have been countermanded, but Princess Margaret will be present at her brother's wedding.

The King is gradually improving in health and officials of the court declare there is no cause for anxiety.

SOUTHAMPTON, Oct. 4.—(Special)—The Very Rev. Herbert Hanson, Dean of Durham, created a sensation at the Church of England Congress last night by a speech in which he openly approved divorce. He declared that the full significance of the growth of the movement in favor of an outbreak of licentiousness. Its strength lay in the fact that it gave expression to the distinctly Christian factor of self-respect that would not acquiesce in a situation which actually became degrading.

It was an error, he said, to fasten attention on divorce statistics, as if any considerable importance attached to them. What really mattered was the standard of personal purity.

The audience listened with some show of uneasiness to Dean Hanson's views and were manifestly relieved when he concluded. Other delegates insisted that the church must maintain the doctrine of permanency in marriages.
