CITY AND SUM'SIDE COUNTRY AND WEST

Guardian Correspondents Everywhere.

The Quarterly meeting of the Methodist Preacher's Association, met yesterday afternoon in the First Methodist Church. The plan of appointments for the various Circuits surrounding the city for the next quarter was given the usual consideration with other matters vital to Christian work. The brethren spoke strongly in favor of aggressive work in the temperance cause, and deplored the prevailing amount of drunkenness in the city.

The managers of the Rink have decided to open a class for teaching skating. They will provide an experienced teacher, every morning except Saturday, during the first month of the season, between the hours of 9 and 10 o'clock, so that any one wishing to learn to skate can do so on good ice and away from the public. There will be no extra charge, the only provision being that you must have a rink ticket. And all wishing to join this class will kindly hand their names to the managers as soon as possible.

HOSPITAL Concert Thursday evening. Under no more auspicious auspices could a concert be given. The object appeals to every one, but few are immune from pain or sickness consequently general sympathy goes out to sufferers. Good wishes and practical shakels are generously given to an institution that is equipped to cope with suffering or illness in its aggravated forms. The program is an excellent one, variety and quality rather than quantity is evidenced by the program. Thursday evening next.

YESTERDAY a suspected case of smallpox was found on board the Schrr, Robin Hood, which has been loading produce at Georgetown. Dr. Stewart visited the patient and found that some slight symptoms of the disease had developed. To avoid all danger of infection, the schooner was wisely ordered to the quarantine grounds where isolation is effected and no danger can accrue. It is understood that a rash has appeared on the patient's body, but the doctor thinks that it may be due to a drug administered for a cold.

The monthly meeting of the School Board was held last evening.—The teacher's report showed the enrollment to be 1262. Average attendance 1036; the percentage of attendance 80; the number of cases of tardiness was 207; truants 13; visits 307; notices 40; corporal punishment 15; requests to leave school before the hour for closing 173. Dr. Jenkins presented the report of his inspection of the city schools to ascertain the number of pupils who were unvaccinated and not successfully vaccinated. The number amounted to 367. These as well as the ones absent on the days of the Doctor's visit, must present certificates of successful vaccination before they will be admitted to school. The resolution passed at the last meeting of the Board will be strictly enforced, and the Teachers are notified to that effect. It was also ordered that the following regulations of the Board of Education be strictly carried out, viz. No pupil who is affected with or exposed to any contagious disease shall be permitted to attend school until he produces the certificate of a medical man that there are no sanitary objections to his re-admission. The city schools will close for Christmas holidays on Tuesday the 24th inst., and re-open on Monday 6th prox. The Secretary was directed to call for tenders for a supply of kindling wood for the schools. Meeting adjourned after passing some bills.
