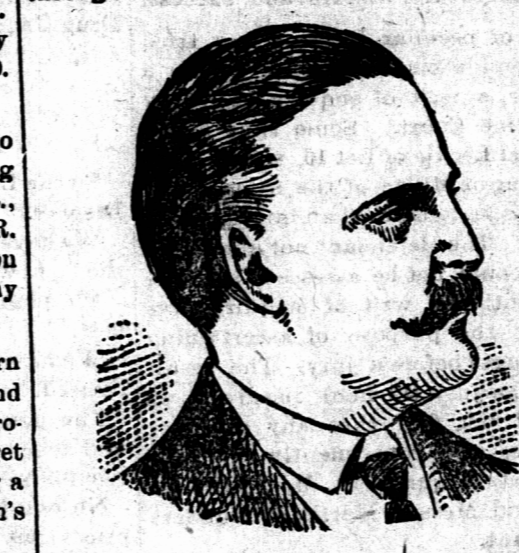


SHORTLY after midnight on Friday morning Mr. Robert Jenkins of Mount Albion was awakened by a bright light shining in his window, and discovered that his two barns were a mass of flames. He and his family were powerless to save anything from the the ruins. The loss includes five horses, one of them a valuable Parkside colt, fifteen cattle, three driving wagons, ninety cases of eggs, his crop of hay and grain, harness, farming implements and tools. There was only \$500 insurance and the loss is roughly estimated at four times that sum. Two of the horses were the property of Mr. J. D. Jenkins, and another belonged to Mr. Harold Jenkins of Charlottetown. Universal sympathy is felt and expressed for Mr. Jenkins, which is the stronger from the fact that the fire was undoubtedly of incendiary origin. There is a general feeling that government and people should join in hunting down and punishing the guilty perpetrators.
