ONTARIO GIRL KIDNAPPED AND HYPNOTIZED

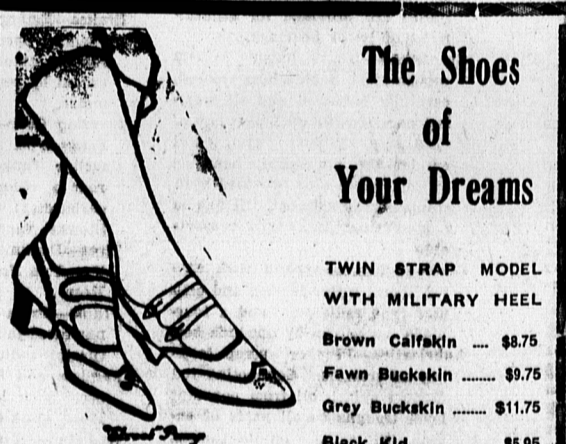
