HOW WE MAY RETRIEVE OUR LOSSES.

What is of even more consequence than the loss of representation at Ottawa is the loss of our people. What is of more consequence still is that the loss shall be restored. How can this be done?

One prime measure to that end must be the improvement of our transportation to and from the mainland with reasonable through freight rates, so as to give our people equal opportunity with those on the mainland to market their produce and to import what they need from abroad.

Then there are our fisheries. The best of food fishes are about shores during almost the whole open season, but little effort is made to gather this abundant harvest of the sea, which is a great source of wealth in other lands. Much might be done by a little enterprise, organization and capital put into the fishing industry.

But farming and fishing give little employment comparatively in winter, and our cold season is pretty long. All-year-round employment is essential to the growth of population. To secure it we must have manufacturing industries. Here the difficulties of transportation beset us and we come round again to the all-importance of improved and cheaper communication with the outside world.

Our hopes for the future and for the restoration of the population we have lost must depend largely on improved and cheaper transportation, but much may be done while that is in preparation. Industrial organization might be begun and our people interested therein. Measures might be taken to make known to the world our resources of soil, and sea, and the openings and promise for various lines of manufacturing industry.

There is no use in crying over spilled milk or lost population. The one thing to be done is to take active, energetic measures, in a hopeful and confident spirit, to regain our lost ground.

OUR REPRESENTATION.

Premier Fleming, who succeeds Hon. J. D. Hazen as head of the New Brunswick Government, is giving his attention to the question of the representation of the Maritime Provinces in the House of Commons.
